- (3) School district responsibility based on residence of parent(s) or legal guardian. The school district where the parent(s) or legal guardian resides shall have both programmatic and financial responsibility under the following circumstances:
 - (a) When a student is in a pediatric nursing home; (b) When a student whose IEP requires an out of district placement lives and receives special education services at a special education residential school pursuant to a placement by the IEP Team; (c) When a student lives and receives educational services in an institutional facility operated by or, through contract, authorized by the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Public Health, the Department of Youth Services, or the Department of Correction or County House of Correction, except as in 603 CMR 28.10(3)(c)1. and 2.
 - 1. If an eligible student was placed or resided in foster care at the time the student entered the institutional facility, then responsibility shall remain with the district(s) assigned most recently pursuant to 603 CMR 28.10(5)(b).
 - 2. If a student is 18 years of age or older and has established his or her own residence as an adult, the school district where the student resided prior to entering the institutional facility shall remain programmatically and fiscally responsible.







Suggestion was made to have a discussion with the NA students who may qualify about their thoughts on the state seal. Maybe we can use words on the diploma rather than the seal. More to come
- Poster Display--classrooms and other prominent places within each school
- Other
 - 1. Megan Tammaro, our Innovative Pathways Mentor, shared information with this group about the Advanced Manufacturing Pathway
 - 2. We discussed after-school language offerings at the elementary school--lunch bunches are missed at KCC and QS
 - 3. The poster message/visual for displaying in all classrooms and prominently in other places in the school is 95% done in terms of the translation from English to Wampanaak. Add picture of chief looking out at the Mashpee River. Include the MWT and Mashpee public schools logo on the poster. Regarding both #4 and #5 above: Our goal is to have Cameron Greendeer attend a monthly PULSE meeting at MMHS (Gr. 7 - 12) and to have Roxanne Mills-Brown attend a monthly PULSE meeting at both Coombs and Quashnet so they can be proactive partners with us as we develop specific strategies and interventions targeted to improve outcomes for each Native American student. A parent/guardian release letter has been prepared for sending to all NA families. Permission must be received from each family.
- 6. MWT Report at monthly school committee meeting
 - a. Suggestion was made that MWT submit a written (bulleted list) of updates for the monthly school committee meeting--maybe include input from Roxanne, Cameron, and Trish (Patty will follow up on this.)

- 7. Basketball game at tribal government center
 - a. The third annual basketball game is scheduled for Thursday, February 13, 2020, at 5 pm.

- 8. Other
 - a. Principal O'Brien reports how happy everyone is that the lunch bunches with Toodie have started up again (about 2 weeks ago)
 - b. Winnie Johnson-Graham will be starting on February 3, 2020 at MMHS to provide support to NA students during lunch blocks 4 days per week (2.5 hours per day)--funded under the MPS IE grant.

 - e. Principal O'Brien will connect with Kitty Hendrick on the third grade field trip that includes the Old Indian Museum.
 - f. Native American Heritage Week is November 16 20, 2020. We will again partner with Cameron Greendeer to plan events at all schools.
 - g. Articulation Agreement with Cape Cod Community College--dual enrollment (NA History Class)--not sure of the status of this (Brian Brodie and Linda Coombs are involved.)
 - h. Joint MPS School Committee and MWT Council meeting will take place at the tribal government center on June 10, 2020.
- Nicole Bartlett appointed Northeast Region Director for the American Indian/Alaska Native (Al/AN) Council of the National School Board Association (NSBA); also new Division 7 Chair of MA Association of School Committees (MASC)
 - a. The purpose of AIAN is to promote quality education for all students with emphasis on the problems and successes of the American Indian/Alaska Native student. It is a discussion forum to connect with school board members across the country around issues impacting AIAN students.
 - b. Division 7 includes the 23 Cape & Islands districts, as well as Carver and Wareham.
 - Both are opportunities to share the work we have been doing in Mashpee for the benefit of other board members in Division 7, the Northeast and nationwide.
 - i. Possibility of having a Division 7 meeting take place at the tribal government center
