Dear Families,

We will be implementing an evidence-based screening at Mashpee Middle/High School during the 2017-18 school year. The screening, required by MA Law (Chapter 52, Acts of 2016), *An Act Relative to Substance Use, Treatment, Education and Prevention* is known as SBIRT, an acronym for Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment. It is a public health model aimed at preventing the use of alcohol, marijuana and/or other substances. Our primary goal is to let students know that their school nurse and counseling staff are available daily to reinforce healthy decision making behaviors and to assist them in obtaining additional support for any substance use or related issue if needed.

The screening process will be part of the annual state mandated screenings that are performed each school year. The school nurse and school counselors will be doing the screening on all 7th and 9th grade students. The screenings will be conducted in a confidential, one-on-one session with each student. We will be utilizing a substance and behavioral health screening tool called the CRAFFT. The tool is recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics and widely used with adolescents in Massachusetts. It consists of ten questions developed to screen adolescents for high-risk alcohol and drug use disorders. It is a short, effective screening tool meant to assess whether a longer conversation about the context of use, frequency and other risks and consequences of alcohol and drug use is warranted. The tool is available to view on the Mashpee District's website.

Students who are not using substances will have their healthy choices reinforced by the screener. The screener will provide brief feedback to any student who reports using a substance or who is at risk for future substance use. We will refer students to our counseling staff for further evaluation with student permission if needed. All students will be provided helpful, educational information regarding substance use.

This program focuses on harm prevention and does not generate any disciplinary action. The results of the screening are not included in the student's school file or school health record. The screening tool will be destroyed in the student's presence at the conclusion of their screening. Parents and/or students have the right to opt out of this screening process. We request that you send a written note to the school nurse no later than October 1st if you wish to opt out.

MMHS School SBIRT Implementation Plan

January 2018: students in Grade 7 and Grade 9 at the Mashpee Middle High School will receive a SBIRT screening by trained staff. Students with 2 or more positive findings on Part B of the CRAFFT screening tool will be discreetly referred to in-house referral sources who will determine the need for appropriate out of school referrals.

3. Which grade and school(s) will be screened?

All grade 7 and grade 9 students at MMHS

4. Who will be in charge of data collection?

5. How will screening results be documented?

No screening results will be documented in student health record. A check-off list will be utilized to verify that all students were screened. Data will be collected and saved on student age and gender only. Positive CRAFFT screening tool results will be shared with in-house referral sources only (i.e. school psychologist/school adjustment counselor, guidance), with student signed consent, unless student found to be at risk

to self or others. All screening documents (without student's name on them) will be shredded. Nurses will have the option to maintain personal records as needed.

6. How will staff be trained? When?

All staff involved in the SBIRT program have attended trainings through the MDPH in collaboration with Boston University and/or Northeastern University.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1: Which staff position(s) will be responsible for conducting screening? (indicate # of staff)

(1) School Nurses (2) School Counselors (adjustment, guidance, etc.)

Other: Guidance Counselors will be backup for adjustment counselors during screenings.

2. How will you ensure privacy and confidentiality for students?

All students will be privately screened in either the nurse or guidance office. Positive screenings will be discreetly referred to in-house referral sources as soon as possible. All completed screening tools will be shredded.

3. What will parents and students be told about privacy and confidentiality?

Parents and students will be advised that student specific written screening responses will be shredded after the screening is completed. Only demographic data will be submitted to the state. SBIRT screening will not be incorporated into the health record. Students will be screened in a private room. Referrals will be discreetly handled. Students will be counseled that the information that they share will only be disclosed if the student is determined to be at risk to self or others.

4. How will school staff and teachers be informed of this screening?

An informational letter describing the screening process will be sent to staff.

5. How will parents be informed of this screening? (i.e. letter home to parents, school bulletin via email, faculty meeting, School Committee Meeting)

A letter describing SBIRT will be mailed to parents in June of 2017. An all call will be done a week before screenings so that parents may have the opportunity to opt out.

1. How will students be informed of this screening?

A brief summary of the SBIRT program will be introduced to 7th and 9th grade

students during their Wellness class.

- 2. When will the screening be performed (i.e., during Health Education or Physical Activity class, other mandated screenings, scheduled visit with counselor, etc)?

Students will be screened during their Wellness Education classes.

- 3. What hand-outs do you have for students? Parents?

Handouts, pamphlets and/or posters from the Massachusetts Health Education Clearinghouse, Alcohol and Other Drug Centers will be made available.

- 4. What in-school referral resources are currently available?

School Adjustment Counselors, School Psychologist

- 5. What outside community resources / agencies have been contacted in case further referral is needed?

There will be a pamphlet with available resources. The SBIRT Implementation Team will update materials and resources on an ongoing basis.

- 6. Who will make outside referrals and follow up, including parent/guardian notification, if needed?

School Adjustment Counselors will notify parents if an outside referral is necessary.

- 7. Who is the contact with these individuals/ agencies?

In-house referral staff (see above) may make contact with outside community agencies, as appropriate, in collaboration with parents, students and primary care providers.

- 8. How will follow-up, technical assistance and training of additional school staff be instituted?

We will continue to send additional staff, as needed, to SBIRT trainings offered through the MDPH in collaboration with Boston University.

- 9. What barriers do you anticipate for implementation?

Availability of substitute nurses and scheduling logistics may be problematic.

10. How might you overcome them?

Arrange substitute nursing coverage early and collaborate with building administrators on scheduling issues

It's the Law....

MA Law-Chapter 52, Acts of 2016. *An Act Relative to Substance Use, Treatment, Education and Prevention*

MDPH-Public Health Model aimed at preventing the use of alcohol, marijuana and other substances.

Structured, evidence-based screening and **conversation**, **universal** screening of selected grade levels (1MMS, 1MHS)

What it is not...

- Not a targeted screening for selected students
- Not intended to get anyone in trouble
- Not drug testing
- Not a treatment program
- Not a part of student health record or student school record

GOALS

- Promotes prevention and reinforces healthy choices
- Identifies early risk for substance use and early intervention
- Let students know that resources are available daily to reinforce healthy decision making behaviors and to assist them in obtaining additional support for any substance use or related issue if needed.

ANNUAL STATE MANDATED SCREENING of Selected Grade Levels

GRADE 7 and GRADE 9- Parents or students can "opt-out"

Confidential 1:1 screening in private setting with each student done by school nurse and school counselors who have received specialized training in this screening process (brief motivational counseling)

CRAFFT tool used- substance and behavioral health screening tool. Recommended by American Academy of Pediatrics.

CRAFFT - Ask initial 4 questions

During the past 12 months, on how many days did you:

- 1- Drink more than a few sips of beer, wine, or and drink containing alcohol?
- 2- Use any marijuana or synthetic marijuana?
- 3- Take a prescription medication or pill that was not prescribed to you or more than what was prescribed to you?
- 4- Use anything else to get high?

if no to all questions: only ask the "Car" question on remainder of tool.

CRAFFT 6 questions asked after initial 4

C- CAR

R- Relax

A- Alone

F- Forget

F- Family and Friends

T- Trouble

Process for:

Negative responses to questions:

-Counselors commend and reinforce student's healthy choices, offer their assistance for any future concerns

Positive responses to questions:

-Additional questions asked, a full screening is done that includes assessment for negative consequences and severity of use and brief intervention and assessment for the need for referral to services

Confidentiality

Consent: Student must consent to screening and any disclosure of information, including disclosure to parents. Forms are shredded at end of interview. No identifying data is collected or documented in school health/school record

Exception: *Imminent harm to self or others*

Record Keeping: anonymous, aggregate data is collected at time of screening and reported to MDPH (age, gender, # of yes/no responses to pre-screen and CRAFFT questions)
