JF School Admission

At the February 3, 2016 school committee meeting, the committee approved a second read on policy JF *School Admissions*. At that time, the committee instructed that counsel be contacted to verify the accuracy of the policy verbiage. After review, the school attorney responded as follows:

Part of the italicized language "who is their parent/legal guardian" is not legally accurate. The student is a resident for attendance purposes irrespective of the relationship of the person with whom they are living. Generally it is a good idea to try to have that adult as a guardian or at least have some authority to make decisions for the student, but it cannot be required.

My recommendation is that the committee hold voting on policy JF and bring it to the policy subcommittee for further review.

IF Multi-Tiered System of Support

At the February 3, 2016 school committee meeting, the committee approved a second read on policy IF Multi-Tiered System of Support.

My recommendation is that the committee vote to approve policy IF.


