The process promotes collaboration and continuous learning and emphasizes professional conversations about teaching and learning. The goal is to provide opportunities for even the most expert educators to improve their practice by working with their colleagues and evaluators. For educators who are in need of improvement, the system provides the opportunity to grow.

Evaluators rate educators on four indicators (Curriculum, Planning, and Assessment; Teaching all Students; Family and Community Engagement; and Professional Culture) using multiple categories of evidence, including observations, multiple measures of student learning, and evidence linked to effective practice, such as samples of student work, lesson plans, and materials showing engagement with families. Administrators are similarly rated by evaluators on four indicators (Instructional Leadership; Management and Operations; Family and Community Engagement; and Professional Culture).

Every educator evaluated in 2014-15 received a Summative Performance Rating of Exemplary, Proficient, Needs Improvement, or Unsatisfactory. The summative rating determines the type of educator plan an educator is placed on for the next cycle. Experienced, effective educators are placed on educator plans of a longer duration that offer them more autonomy. Plans are designed to provide educators with meaningful feedback and support. The types of plans include:

<u>Self-Directed Growth Plan</u> – a one- or two-year plan for experienced educators who were rated Proficient or Exemplary

<u>Directed Growth Plan</u> – a plan up to one year in length for educators rated Needs Improvement

Improvement Plan – a plan of 30 calendar days up to one school year for educators rated Unsatisfactory

<u>Developing Educator Plan</u> – a one-year plan for educators without Professional Teaching Status (also known as tenure), administrators in their first three years in a district, or at the discretion of an evaluator for an educator in a new assignment

Eventually, educators will receive two ratings, a Summative Performance Rating and a Student Impact Rating (High, Moderate or Low). The Student Impact Rating must be informed by at least two years of data that includes student growth percentiles from state assessments when possible, and by common measures chosen at the district level; those are referred to as district-determined measures. Some districts will begin issuing Student Impact Ratings following the 2015-16 school year, after trends and patterns across multiple measures have been established. In Massachusetts, student results do not make up a particular percent of an educator's evaluation, and in every evaluation, the evaluator's professional judgment is the overriding factor. The Commonwealth's two-rating educator evaluation framework is unique and reflects the importance of providing educators with meaningful feedback about both their practice and their impact on student learning to supporting their professional growth.

Massachusetts School Building Authority – Statement of Interest

As you are aware, the need for replacement of the windows at the Quashnet School was identified in the Capital Needs Assessment completed in 2010. Since that time, the project has included on the Town's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) but has not been funded. It is again included in the FY17 CIP.

The Town has been unsuccessful in securing grants to assist with the estimated project costs. Building envelope improvements are not eligible for incentives from the utility companies or for grants from the Green Communities program. The Town had applied for a grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) in 2013 but was not selected.

The MSBA recently opened their application process for 2016. Replacement of windows is one of the eligible projects in the Accelerated Repair Program. DPW will be submitting a Statement of Interest (SOI) on behalf of the Town. The deadline for this submittal is February 12th. No funding commitment by the Town is required at this time though a vote of both the Board of Selectmen and School Committee in support of the project is (see attached language).

Submittal of the SOI is just the first step in the MSBA approval process. The MSBA reviews the SOIs received and schedules a site visit. Generally, this review is completed within 3 months and the MSBA invites selected projects to complete a schematic design and budget. Within 60 days of this invitation, the Town would have to commit to pay 100% of the cost of the design (the MSBA would reimburse the Town at Mashpee's base rate — around 38% in past years). Upon completion of the design, the MSBA votes whether to fund the final design and construction. This vote is typically made approximately 12 months after the initial SOI

submittal. Within 90 days of this approval, the Town would have to commit to pay 100% of these costs (again, the MSBA would reimburse the Town at Mashpee's base rate).

The project is replacement of the windows throughout the school. The windows are original to the building's construction in 1978. There is significant air leakage around the windows, the steel frames are eroded and rusted, and seals have failed, trapping moisture between the glass panes. The resulting heat loss has resulted in higher energy costs to sustain a minimum level of comfort for students and staff.






