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## MASHPEE ATHLETIC HANDBOOK PROPOSED CHANGES

This is the portion that we are removing:

According to Rule of the Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association Handbook, if a Middle School has a separate Principal other than the High School and a separate athletic program, those Middle School student-athletes are prohibited from playing on High School teams unless the following circumstances are evident:

- A specific sport that is offered at the High School is not offered at the Middle School (with a waiver from the MIAA, District C, and South Shore League).
- A waiver from the South Shore League, District C, and MIAA allowing Middle School students to play on Varsity teams to enable that sport to continue and not disband.
- A specific waiver from the MIAC, Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Council, allowing certain teams to play on Sub varsity teams to insure that Junior Varsity team rosters only can be filled, despite the fact that the Middle School has a viable athletic program of its own.

On May 10, 2012, the MIAC voted affirmatively 13-0 to support the Mashpee request to allow eighth graders to participate on sub varsity teams only, to insure that Junior Varsity teams could field a complete roster. This request was voted for a two-year cycle (2012-2013, 2013-2014). At the end of this cycle Mashpee would, again, have to re-apply for this waiver if necessary.

Thus, Mashpee eighth graders can play on the following High School teams without restriction:

- Indoor track
- JV golf

Mashpee eighth graders can play on the following High School teams only in order to insure that team can continue to compete:









- Tennis
- Cross Country
- Any JV or Freshman team that cannot field a complete roster.

\*No freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior will be displaced or "cut" from any team because of these waivers

\* Eighth graders can only compete at the lowest level of competition offered to help insure that a JV or Freshman team can compete. Thus, eighth graders may not bypass a level of competition in a sport to player at a higher level offered. For example, an eight grade field hockey player can not play varsity field hockey if there is a JV team offered



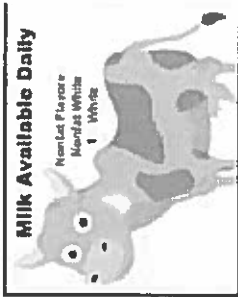
