Dear Incoming Third Graders,

During your months away from school, we would like you to reflect upon your summer experiences, thoughts, and adventures in a journal. Below you will find different writing prompts to help inspire your thoughts. We would like to have a balance of subject areas in Math, Hebrew and Literacy; please choose one of these focus areas each week. We would like for you to include at **least two math and two Hebrew entries** during the summer and to aim for a total of at least 10 entries total. We only wish for you to spend 20-25 minutes a week on your journal entries. We look forward to you coming back and using these journal entries to share information about yourself and your summer. We encourage you to express your creative side by adding sketches, drawings, photos, math problems etc. to your weekly journaling. Below are some prompts and suggestions to inspire your thinking. In addition to journaling, we would like for you to keep a list of the books that you have read and to be ready to share with your classmates in August. We are looking forward to spending a fantastic year together.

Ideas:

Writing Prompts:

- Write and/or draw about one thing you do really well and describe it in detail.
- What is your favorite room in your home and why?
- Describe what it means to be a good person.
- Write and/or draw about your favorite day of the week.
- What is your favorite song and why?
- Write a poem about your favorite summer things.
- If you could choose a different name, what would you choose and why?
- What would you eat if you were on a deserted island?
- Who do you consider to be a hero in your life? Write about why you view that person as your hero.
- Write about a time when someone did something kind and unexpected for you.

- You are a bird that can fly. Write a story about what you see.
- “I walked into the closet and came out in another world called _____” Continue this story.
- If you could make 3 wishes for anything, as long as it was not for something that directly benefited you, what would you wish for?
- Write about some ways that you could help someone that you know is sad?
- What does it mean to be “charitable”? Why should people give to others?
- Choose your favorite holiday and explain why you enjoy it.
- Explain what you like most about summer vacation.
- Write a list of things you did this summer, see if you can come up with something for each letter of the alphabet.
- If you could choose any season to last all year, what would you choose and why?
- How do you feel when summer ends?

Reading Prompts:

- Write about the first time you ever read your favorite book. Why did you like it?
- Choose a character from a book that you are currently reading and describe how this character is similar to you and different from you.
- Think about the setting of the current book that you are reading. Write another short story that takes place in that same setting.
- Make a list of vocabulary words that are new to you while reading your book. Look up the meanings and write down their definitions.
- Think about your least favorite book/story. Write down why it is your least favorite and how you would change it to make it better.
- Picture yourself in one of the books that you are reading this summer. Put yourself into that setting, what do you see, smell, hear, feel, taste?
- What questions would you ask the author about a summer book you are reading?

Math:

- Write about and think how math comes into your everyday life, e.g. sport scores, recipes, etc.
- Create a math word problem and have another member of your family solve it.
- How many ways can you get to the number 50? (use all types of math concepts, eg. $100-50=50$, $25 \times 2=50$)
- Take a recipe, double the servings, and write down how much of the ingredients you now need.
- While at the grocery store, estimate how much the total will be. Then find the difference between your estimate and the actual total.
- If you can get a 2-liter bottle of soda for \$1.50 or a 1.5-liter bottle of soda for \$1, which would you choose? Why?

Hebrew:

- Draw a picture and write a word or sentence (in Hebrew) about each of the following.
 - Hobbies
 - Summer Break
 - Camp
 - Summer Trips
