Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited college or university.
- Cumulative undergraduate GPA indicative of success in graduate school, generally 3.0 or greater on a 4.0 scale.
- Submission of a completed online application, including official transcripts to all colleges attended, the Essay of Intent/Personal Statement, CV/resume, and two recommendation forms from academic and/or professional references (GRE currently waived because of COVID-19.)
