ATTENDANCE

If your child misses school or is late for <u>any reason</u>, call the Attendance line, <u>317-544-5000</u>, option #1, 24 hours a day.

Students will be marked 'unverified' (unexcused) without a call from a parent.

If your student was marked unverified in a class for the day, you will receive an automated call that evening. An unverified absence means we have not received a phone call from a parent/guardian about the absence. If you receive this phone call and feel it is in error, please have your student talk with the teacher who marked the absence or you can contact the teacher via email. If the absence needs to be marked differently, the teacher will contact the Attendance Office to make the change.

All medical verification can be emailed to AHSAttendance@avon-schools.org

The Indiana State Department of Health sets the immunization requirements for students attending public schools in Indiana. For the 2020-2021 school year, all students in grades K-12 will be required to have 2 appropriately spaced doses of Hepatitis A vaccine. Contact your health care provider to ask what vaccines your child may need. Low cost immunizations are available

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at the Hendricks County Health Department at 317-745-9222.

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All students still not up to date with their immunizations need to have appointments made. Parents please call the AHS clinic with the appointment dates. Students with future appointment dates will not be excluded from school. Thank you!

Indiana Graduation Pathways



With the passage of Graduation Pathways, students are now able to individualize their graduation requirements to align to their postsecondary goal. No longer must all students fit into the same academic mold, but rather, they can choose the options that best meet their postsecondary needs and aspirations. Students can create pathways that serve their educational interests and prepare them for postsecondary educational and career opportunities.



Although this begins with the class of 2023 (current sophomores), juniors and seniors may also take advantage of this option as an alternative to passing ISTEP as their graduation qualifying exam.

With scheduling at Avon High School for the 2021-2022 school year right around the corner, counselors will be discussing Graduation Pathways with their students during their individual scheduling meetings. Counselors will talk with students about the different options available to them for fulfilling their employability skills component as well as their post-secondary competencies. Options to consider may include activities within the community, having a job, and/or involvement in school organizations, sports, performing arts, and certain classes. Students might also focus on different course choices that, taken in sequence, will concentrate on an individualized career pathway. Freshmen will hear more about Graduation Pathways from the school counselors in their Prep for College & Career course this school year.

Families are encouraged to talk with your student about career and course interests. The <u>Indiana Career Guide</u> and the <u>Indiana</u> <u>Graduation Pathways Overview</u> are great resources for these conversations. Temporary Free Meals

Dear ACSC Families:

To address the hardships that many families are facing due to Coronavirus, the USDA (U.S. Department of Agriculture) has implemented a <u>temporary</u> program under the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) that will allow all school breakfasts and lunches to be provided free of charge. ACSC started this program on Monday, September 14th.

Breakfasts and lunches will be provided free of charge—regardless of whether your child qualifies for free/reduced lunch. However, this program is <u>temporary</u> and will only be available by the USDA until December 31st or until the funds run out.

A la carte items will still be available for sale and we encourage all families to leave current funds in your child's lunch account as the program could end at any time. Families will still be able to add funds to your child's lunch account for a la carte items using the Titan Family Portal or by sending cash or check to the school.

Families are still welcome to pack lunches as participation is completely optional.



Clothing Voucher Program

The Washington Township Assistance Program has launched a Clothing Voucher program for school-aged children enrolled in a school within Washington Township.

The process is similar to the current process for applying for Township Assistance. One must come into the office to pick up an application and set an appointment. The household will need to verify all pertinent information the same as any other application: Identification, Household expenses, Resources, Income. In addition, for clothing, verification of school enrollment within Washington Township will be required. The income standards are set at the same level as Free Lunch Program, 130% of poverty level.

If approved, a voucher will be issued for Burlington Coat Factory in Plainfield to purchase school clothing. Permitted items are: Shirts, Pants, Shorts, Dresses/Skirts, Underclothes, Shoes, Socks, winter outer clothing, and belts. Clients who are approved are eligible for up to \$300 a calendar year per child. This, at the discretion of the Assistance Director, may be distributed in 2 separate vouchers of \$150 each. This is to ensure that children have enough and appropriate clothing throughout the seasons of the school year.

What are Water Beads?

Water beads are water-absorbing beads made from super absorbent polymer, often marketed as toys or learning aids.

Water beads have many names, including but not limited to jelly beads, water orbs, hydro orbs, polymer beads, gel beads, and Orbeez. When these tiny balls are placed in water, they can expand up to 200 times their original size. They only shrink back down to size when left to dry. They come in various colors and shapes like spheres, jewels, dinosaurs, etc.

Water beads can be used as educational tools and a form of entertainment for young children and children living with autism or increased anxiety. At the younger end of the spectrum, these beads can further develop sensory skills and hand-eye coordination. With a little more age, children can use water beads to make/play various games and practice math skills such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.

Benefits of using water beads:

- Develop sensory skills and increase hand-eye coordination
- Improve counting, sorting, and matching skills
- Kinesthetically learn to differentiate between colors


Educational, but Requires Supervision

Water beads hold potential to educate and entertain children, but they may also pose a serious safety risk.

The shape and color of water beads make them look uncannily similar to various candies often marketed to children. The younger the child, the more difficult it is for them to differentiate between the two. If swallowed, water beads can continue growing in size as they travel through the intestines because they don't dissolve; ultimately, this may lead to an obstruction of the gastrointestinal tract. Unfortunately, there are also multiple reported cases of children putting Water beads in their ears. The beads are often difficult to see, especially if they are clear beads. In some cases, the beads could only be removed surgically and lead to ear drum damage or some form of hearing loss.

Water beads can be educational and endlessly entertaining for kids, but they should be kept out of reach from toddlers or anyone under the age of five. If there is any chance of a toddler getting ahold of water beads, it's recommended to completely remove all water beads from that environment. The best way to have fun with water beads and stay as safe as possible is to maintain constant supervision and/or hand on interaction.

Should a situation arise in which your child needs to be admitted to a hospital, remember Hendricks Regional Health is home to Hendricks County's only designated pediatric unit, specially designed to treat children. - Refusing to eat
- Abdominal Swelling and soreness
- Complaints that something is stuck in the throat or chest
- Drooling
- Wheezing
- Vomiting
- Constipation
