ATTENDANCE

If your child misses school or is late for <u>any reason</u>, call the Attendance line, <u>317-544-5000</u>, option #1, 24 hours a day.

Students will be marked 'unverified' (unexcused) without a call from a parent.

If your student was marked unverified in a class for the day, you will receive an automated call that evening. An unverified absence means we have not received a phone call from a parent/guardian about the absence. If you receive this phone call and feel it is in error, please have your student talk with the teacher who marked the absence or you can contact the teacher via email. If the absence needs to be marked differently, the teacher will contact the Attendance Office to make the change.

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The Indiana State Department of Health sets the immunization requirements for students attending public schools in Indiana. For the 2020-2021 school year, all students in grades K-12 will be required to have 2 appropriately spaced doses of Hepatitis A vaccine. Contact your health care provider to ask what vaccines your child may need. Low cost immunizations are available at the Hendricks County Health Department at 317-745-9222.

All students still not up to date with their immunizations need to have appointments made. Parents please call the AHS clinic with the appointment dates. Students with future appointment dates will not be excluded from school. Thank you!

A note from our

Mental Wellness Provider,

Ms. Cheviron:



This year has presented all of us with many challenges and on many different levels. Not only have we been faced repeatedly with uncertainty, but we've been asked to be more flexible than ever as things outside of our control have changed and ended with little to no warning. Most of us have noticed that there have been times when we have really struggled and we've noticed that in our kids, too. Now, as much as ever, having conversations about our mental health is essential to staying well. If you've been wondering how to start these conversation with your child, or get connected to the care you need, we are here to support you through it with some tips and resources!



You don't need any magic tricks or words to begin talking with your child about mental health. The best thing you can do to get the conversation started is to ask genuine questions while providing your full presence and attention. Listening without judgement, being patient, and showing empathy are all ways to validate someone's feelings and reminds them that it is safe to talk about these things. Two simple questions can go a long way in supporting our youth (and us grown-ups, too for that matter); WHAT DO YOU NEED RIGHT NOW and HOW CAN I HELP YOU? Keep in mind, these talks are more about practice than perfection. The more you can make these conversations part of your family norm, the more likely your child is to feel comfortable

opening up about the important, and critical, things when they come up.

Our teens are key collaborators in helping to reduce stigma and normalize conversations about mental health and wellbeing. If your child has a passion for this topic, there are many ways to get involved including a mental health club at AHS called Bring Change to Mind. This is a positive outlet for students to work together to turn their ideas into actions and help make an impactful change related to our school culture and how we address and support mental wellbeing. Encouraging our kids to be a mental health advocate and to ask for support when needed are both important steps we can take as guardians and role models in their lives.

If you notice that your child is needing more direct support for their own mental health needs, we offer Mental Wellness Services at school in the form of peer groups and are partnered with Cummins Behavioral Health to offer school-based, individual therapy. Hendricks County Health Partnership also offers a vast amount of community resources, including a

Temporary Free Meals

Dear ACSC Families:

To address the hardships that many families are facing due to Coronavirus, the USDA (U.S. Department of Agriculture) has implemented a <u>temporary</u> program under the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) that will allow all school breakfasts and lunches to be provided free of charge. ACSC started this program on Monday, September 14th.

Breakfasts and lunches will be provided free of charge—regardless of whether your child qualifies for free/reduced lunch. However, this program is **temporary** and will only be available by the USDA until December 31st or until the funds run out.

A la carte items will still be available for sale and we encourage all families to leave current funds in your child's lunch account as the program could end at any time. Families will still be able to add funds to your child's lunch account for a la carte items using the Titan Family Portal or by sending cash or check to the school.

Families are still welcome to pack lunches as participation is completely optional.





Clothing Voucher Program

The Washington Township Assistance Program has launched a Clothing Voucher program for school-aged children enrolled in a school within Washington Township.

The process is similar to the current process for applying for Township Assistance. One must come into the office to pick up an application and set an appointment. The household will need to verify all pertinent information the same as any other application: Identification, Household expenses, Resources, Income. In addition, for clothing, verification of school enrollment within Washington Township will be required. The income standards are set at the same level as Free Lunch Program, 130% of poverty level.

If approved, a voucher will be issued for Burlington Coat Factory in Plainfield to purchase school clothing. Permitted items are: Shirts, Pants, Shorts, Dresses/Skirts, Underclothes, Shoes, Socks, winter outer clothing, and belts. Clients who are approved are eligible for up to \$300 a calendar year per child. This, at the discretion of the Assistance Director, may be distributed in 2 separate vouchers of \$150 each. This is to ensure that children have enough and appropriate clothing throughout the seasons of the school year.
