Summarizing

Inferring

Discuss the book with your child by asking one or two of these questions:


	What were the most important things the writer had to say? What is the book mostly about? Can you tell about the book in only a few sentences? What is something that happened in the story that you think is important? How would you describe this character (plot, setting)?
Predicting	What do you think (predict) will happen? Do you need to change your predictions based on what you read? What do you think will do? Why do you think that? Based on what you know about the story, what do you think the big ideas of this story might be?
	What did make you think about? What is the author really trying to say when he/she said ? Why do you think did that? What do you think is the writer's purpose for writing this?
Connections	What were you thinking about when you read the book? How does this story remind you of your own life? How does this book remind you of other books you have read? Why might learning about this topic be important?
	What does this story remind you of? What impact has the character made on you? What message or lesson does this story teach about life? How else could the character have acted? What would you have done differently?
Analyzing	What did you notice about how the author organized the book? What did you notice about how the author used words? How did the writer make the book interesting (funny, exciting)? What dangers or problems does the character encounter? How does he/she handle them?
	What character did you like or dislike? Why? What makes this a good book? What did you find most interesting? Why? If you were the author, how would you have written the book differently?







1. Use the web browser Edge. From the TPS website, select Office 365, as shown circled below.




2. Select All apps, as shown below.




3. Then select "All apps" at the top, as pictured below.
