The EduTrust Certification is the Singapore government's highest level of quality assurance for Private Education Institutions on the island. EduTrust Certification provides families with the knowledge that ICS is operating according to the highest academic and operational standards. ICS's EduTrust Certification also allows ICS to enroll students on a Student Pass, a service we provide to 15% of ICS students.

The assessors noted a number of strengths at ICS, including the school's commitment to our mission, vision, core values, and Expected Student Outcomes as well as our programs which are designed to provide students with a holistic experience such as Week Without Walls, college and career counseling, and extracurricular activities. The assessors also noted ICS's commitment to planning high-quality, engaging courses for students.


Academics


We are pleased to announce that ICS students consistently perform well above the United States norm. ICS is often ranked at or above the 95th percentile of schools globally in the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) testing.


All students in the elementary and middle school take NWEA's MAP test throughout the year. The MAP test is given in mathematics, reading, and language usage. The MAP test is adaptive to each student's academic level, allowing ICS teachers and administration to ensure each student is receiving an education personalized to the student's academic needs.

ICS uses this MAP test data in four ways:

- To provide teachers with information about each student's instructional needs
- To identify students who may need additional support
- To monitor growth over time, both during the school year and over consecutive school years
- To provide an external benchmark of student performance against schools in Singapore, Asia, and the United States







Financial Overview (2018-2019)

We are pleased to report that ICS continues to be in a strong financial position. Our audited financial results for 2018-19 were within the plan. Because of the quality of our educational offerings, small class sizes, and lower tuition, we continue to be at near capacity despite numerous vacancies at competing schools. Teacher salary and benefits are the largest components of expenses. With rising labor costs in Singapore, there will continue to be a need for annual moderate tuition increases. We are committed to operating as efficiently as possible to keep these increases as small as possible.

ICS maintains financial reserves equal to approximately half-a-year's operating expenses. These reserves provide a buffer in case of an unexpected decline in enrollment and allow the school to make strategic investments.




Student Population








Academic Staff Statistics

Parent Teacher Fellowship

Physical Education: Gymnastics equipment

"Having this equipment for our P.E. department will help us to teach a more in-depth gymnastics unit. We currently are not able to cover all the standards with the equipment we have available, so having this equipment will ensure that we are able to cover all of the standards for gymnastics for each grade level. Secondly, having this equipment will also open up for much more body movement exploration and it will provide much more support in learning for the individual student. Lastly, I am also hoping that with the equipment here we might have the chance to offer a gymnastics ECA."

Technology: Photon Robot

"Photon is an incredible classroom tool that engages students in not only learning code, but discussing emotions, applying their academic learning concepts to problem-solving situations, and collaborating to achieve goals. Photon works on multiple levels, making it accessible to pre-readers and older students, moving them from basic spatial awareness to working with python-style code. We have used Photon in the younger elementary grades to practice the logical thinking and collaboration needed in coding, as well as an application tool in discussions about math and phonics. We have also used Photon in older grades to introduce students to the syntax used in python code, challenge students to build coded prototypes and improve them with feedback, and to apply mathematical and language concepts to guide Photon in completing tasks."

Design Technology: Mobile Media Kit and tripod

"In Grade 7 Design Technology, students are learning various filming and editing techniques to create their own short film. The Padcaster Verse Mobile Media kits allow students to take more professional shots that are stable and have high quality audio. Through this project, students are developing their ability to creatively communicate their ideas by filming different types of shots and using music to enhance the viewer's experience."

Service Learning

The school experience doesn't stop at the classroom door. In fact, many would say that the activities that happen outside the classroom are just as important. At ICS, we emphasize going beyond the walls of our school to give back to the community, and to make the world a better place to live in.

Over the years we have fostered links with several charity organizations across South East Asia to help and support those in need. The service-learning journey for middle and high school students begins with being "buddies" to ICS elementary students. This program lasts for an entire school year and has two main goals: to foster the connections made between middle and high school students and elementary school students, and to provide learning opportunities for both groups. The middle and high school students get to practice working with children, and our elementary school students get to pray for their buddies. The middle and high school students also play a role in setting an example for their elementary school buddies and get them thinking about how they can start to serve their community.

Our service-learning journey culminates in our FaithWorks program for middle school and our mandatory high school Week Without Walls program. Both programs have students spending a week serving others in different locations across South East Asia. Over the years, teams have built relationships with ministry partners in Bangladesh, China, Cambodia, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, and the Philippines.

"Week Without Walls has helped me change my perspective about life. I no longer only think about myself, but also about others around me. The service-learning trip has taught me how to serve others without expecting anything back. And it is so rewarding to see my efforts transform a place to look and function better.
