Dear Parents,

After a busy year of remote learning and assessments, the Great Outdoors week has been a lovely relief. The children have enjoyed being off-timetable and trying some different activities. Miss Parsons has done an amazing job of putting this massive programme together, and my thanks go to her for this. It will be super to see the Juniors enjoy their Olympic experience next week too.

You will be aware of the news and concerns around children's mental wellbeing, and I believe that young people of today have so much more to deal with than when we were young. At Millfield Prep we aim to have a holistic approach to education and I firmly believe that if we can remove as many of the children's barriers to learning as possible then they are more likely to achieve their potential. Poor mental health and wellbeing are barriers that are being talked about so much at the minute. However, young children may not even be aware of their mental state and they may not even realise that they have a developing issue. So I wanted us, as a school, to proactively teach our children (a) how to identify any signs or symptoms within themselves, or their friends and (b) to give them the skills to support themselves with self-care before things escalate for them.

Therefore, I am delighted to announce that we will be launching our own bespoke Mental Wellbeing Programme for the children in Years 7 and 8 from September 2021. I would like to emphasise that this will in no way replace other subjects, which are just as good for their well-being, such as PE, PSHEE, music, art etc., but will add to and strengthen what we already have. I can hardly believe that we have only one week left until the end of this historic and memorable academic year. Your children have been impressive and we are all very proud of them.

## CRICKET


