Practice saying the alphabet. Can you name the letters in your name? How many letters are in your first and last names?

Make a counting book. Fold six pieces of paper in half. Have your child write one number on each page 0-10. Go outside and find an item/object to match the number (ex. 1- Car, 2-Trees). Illustrate your book by adding the item to your book.

Art mosaic! Create a beautiful mosaic by letting your child glue down leaves, petals, and grass in patterns, shapes, your name, or images on a paper.

Pick a Pen Pal

Pick someone from your family list above to be your pen pal. Write a greeting using pictures and words. Mail it in an envelope with a stamp.

Sort toys or jewelry by color and size (ex: cars, bracelets, bows). Afterwards, make a pattern with your toys or jewelry.

Move like a bug! Encourage your learner to wiggle like a worm, hop like

a grasshopper, buzz like a bee, and curl up like a roly-poly bug. Afterwards, ask your learner to name a bug and show how it moves.
