ASK FOR HELP • GETTING STARTED ON CAMPUS

- Encourage youth to talk to a trusted adult & ask for support.
- Students and parents can contact administrators, deans, or school counselors for support. Administrators will identify and refer students for on-campus intervention services and outside support services.
- SBUSD 7th-12th have on-campus FSA therapists that provide crisis intervention, individual counseling, and mental health referrals.
- Students and parents can make a confidential report with the school administrator or go to school website and use online form to report harassing, bullying, intimidating, and/or threatening behavior.
