Mrs. Narus, our **Hidden Creek Counselor**, has set up a Google Classroom where students in grades 2-5 can find short videos, counselor talks, activities and material on the topics of emotions regulation, calming down strategies, empathy and problem solving. There is also a Parent Resources section and Bitmoji virtual calming room where students click around the room to learn ways to calm down with movement and breathing, hear read alouds on books like "The Giving Tree" and "The Way I Feel," and watch jelly fish swim to calming music. There is also a "Check-In Request Form" on the site for students to request a phone check-in from Mrs. Narus. All materials are on the "Classwork" page.

#### **Will the SK Online schedule & format stay the same?**

Yes, the instructional model will stay the same, and will be using the same materials that will be used in the SK Flex "in person" model. There are pacing guides for Math and English Language Arts that will be followed by teachers in both models. There may be changes to the specific times of lessons, but the intent is to maintain the current schedule as much as possible.

#### **Will the SK Online teachers be Hidden Creek teachers?**

We do have teachers at Hidden Creek who will be teaching online. Human Resources will be working on specific grade level assignments for SK Online at each school. As soon as those assignments are finalized, I will communicate this out to families.

#### **Are you providing transportation for all students attending SK Flex?**

Yes. On the survey in Skyward, there is a question asking you whether or not you will be utilizing transportation for your student(s).

#### **How large will class sizes be in each session of SK Flex?**

Our classrooms can hold up to 14 students and maintain social distancing, however based on our current enrollment, we will have between 11-13 students per section.
