To: Parents of Algebra 1 students

It is exciting, isn't it - the prospect of 36 fun-filled weeks of algebra – an opportunity for lots of quality time and meaningful dialogue with your teenager. While specifics regarding curriculum, grading and classroom rules will be forthcoming during the first week of class; one aspect of the course requires your immediate attention.

Your daughter/son **must have a graphing calculator** for use in the Algebra 1 class. Successful completion of the course is dependent upon (among other things) calculator proficiency. Students will use calculators not only in class, but also for homework and on most tests and quizzes, including the "big one": EOC. We recommend that you purchase a Texas Instrument 84+ or 84+CE (Note: TI89's and TI 92's are not allowed). These calculators will be sufficient for the rest of high school – all the way through pre-calculus. Calculators may be purchased at numerous places: Staples, Office Depot, Target,

Wal-Mart, etc. Prices vary, but you should be able to find one for around \$100.

Your support in this matter is greatly appreciated. We are looking forward to your active involvement in your student's education.
