Community Eligibility Provision

Kings Canyon Unified School District is participating in the National School Lunch and Breakfast Program (NSLP) for the current school year 2016-2017. The school sites listed below are approved for the Community Eligibility Provision which allows all enrolled students to receive breakfast and lunch at **NO CHARGE**. If your children attend any of these schools listed below, breakfast/lunch will be available to them at **no charge**.

AL Conner, Alta, Citrus, Dunlap Leadership Academy, Dunlap, Grant, Great Western, Jefferson, Kings Canyon High School, Lincoln, McCord, Navelencia, Orange Cove High School, Reedley High School, Silas Bartsch, Sheridan, TL Reed, Washington

Reedley Middle College High School will continue to participate in the NSLP – Provision 2 program for the 2016-2017 school year. All enrolled students may participate and are eligible to receive breakfast/lunch at **NO CHARGE**. Confidential meal applications will **not** be required at this time.

Riverview School will continue to participate in the NSLP – Provision 2 program for the 2016-2017 school year. This year Riverview families will be requested to complete a confidential meal application at the beginning of the 2016-2017 school year. One application per family is requested/required. **The application assists with qualifying schools for Grants and other Federal funding which may provide in areas such as technology, curriculum, and equipment.** All enrolled students may participate and are eligible to receive breakfast/lunch at **NO CHARGE**.

Studies have shown that children who are not hungry perform better in school. By providing breakfast/lunch to all children at **no charge**, we are hoping to create a better learning environment for our students.

The school breakfast and lunch that we serve follows U.S. Department of Agriculture guidelines for healthy school meals. The Universal Meals Program cannot succeed without your support; please encourage your children to participate in school meal programs.

All Meals will be served to all students at **no charge** regardless of the eligibility status.
