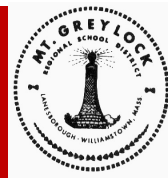

## **THE SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY**

Mt. Greylock Regional School is a six-year, public secondary school comprising grades 7-12 located in the college town of Williamstown in the northwest corner of Massachusetts bordering New York and Vermont. The regional district comprises two communities, Williamstown and Lanesborough, representing a combined population of approximately 10,728. Located in the Berkshires, Williamstown and Lanesborough are rural in character. The area's principal industries are tourism, education, and medical services. The school population benefits from local resources such as Williams College, the Clark Art Institute, Mass MOCA, Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts, and Berkshire Community College.

## **ACADEMICS**

Grade Point Average- A yearly **weighted** grade point average is calculated on a 4.8 scale according to the values below, however, students are not ranked on an individual basis. All graded courses, including class failures, are included in the GPA, with the exception of wellness. Grades in Honors and Advanced Placement courses are **weighted**. For the Class of 2018, the highest GPA is a 4.52 and the lowest is a 1.092 with a median GPA of 3.605

## **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

Two hundred thirty-four credits are required to graduate. Full year courses earn 10 credits; semester courses 5 credits; wellness and health accrue at 3 credits per semester. Students complete their graduation requirements in four years taking 66-68 credits per year.
