



Dress Code Years R – 11

Years R - 6

- During the working School day School uniform must be worn
- Skirts, tunics and dresses should be knee length
- Jumper sleeves must not be rolled up
- Shoes must be black, with a sensible heel
- Long navy socks or tights must be worn with winter uniform and white socks with Prep Summer Dresses
- The School fleece or navy waterproof jacket are the only outdoor garments which may be worn
- Only School regulation scarfs are allowed and must not be worn indoors
- Make-up and nail varnish must not be worn
- Jewellery is not to be worn; exceptions are:
 - A wristwatch
 - A single pair of small stud earrings, worn separately, one in each earlobe (Other forms of body piercing are not allowed)
- Hair must be of a natural colour
- If hair reaches the shoulders, hair must be tied back neatly, using a School tartan, navy, black or brown fastening

Years 7 – 11

- During the working School day, School uniform must be worn
- Skirts must be knee length
- Blouses must be worn tucked in and long sleeves fastened at the cuff; collars must not be turned up
- Jumper sleeves must not be rolled up
- Shoes must be black, with a sensible heel
- Short navy socks or tights must be worn
- The School fleece, gilet, the navy waterproof jacket, a plain navy coat, MSJ Sports hoodie, new quilted jacket or lightweight puffer jacket are the only outdoor garments which may be worn.
- In very cold weather the School fleece or new Softshell jacket may be worn indoors with permission.
- Only School regulation scarfs are allowed and must not be worn indoors
- Make-up and nail varnish must not be worn
- Jewellery is not to be worn; exceptions are:
 - A wristwatch
 - A single pair of small stud earrings, worn separately, one in each earlobe (Other forms of body piercing are not allowed)
 - A simple necklace
- Hair must be of a natural colour
- If hair reaches the shoulders, hair must be tied back neatly and fully, using a School tartan, navy, black or brown fastening
- For formal School occasions, the School jacket and 40 -70 denier navy tights must be worn

Choir uniform

- School open necked white blouse
- School jacket
- Navy tights, 40 denier



Sixth Form Dress Code

Sixth Form students are expected to dress smartly, as befits a professional working environment, unless they are in the Sixth Form Centre.

During the School Working Day

- Smart tailored suit or coordinated jacket and skirt / trousers / dress in any colour with navy, black or flesh coloured plain tights.
- Skirt length must be no more than 5cm above the knee

For Formal Occasions

- A smart tailored suit in a dark colour
- Skirt length must be no more than 5cm above the knee
- Choir uniform (where relevant), navy blue skirt suit, white open necked blouse, navy 40 denier tights.

Accessories

- Smart shoes which are also comfortable and have sensible heels
- Smart (indoor) scarves can be worn as an optional accessory

Games Kit

- If it is necessary for you to wear this in a class, please seek the permission of the Sports staff beforehand.

Dress Down Friday

- On Exeat and Half-term Fridays, smart, casual dress may be worn.

Not acceptable during the school day between 07:30 and 19:00

- Denim, leather (except shoes), jeans, leggings, socks unless invisible, tight-fitting, tube or very short (shorter than mid-thigh length) skirts, T-shirts, strappy tops, cropped tops, logos, writing, hoodies, sweatshirts, rugby shirts, trainers, flip-flops, heels higher than 7cm, hats and coats indoors, excessive make-up.

Not acceptable at any time

- Multiple piercings, tattoos, unnatural hair colour
