

CAIU BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The following actions were taken at the **March 21, 2013** meeting held at the Enola Office of the Capital Area Intermediate Unit.

Reports/Updates

- Alicia McDonald, Director of Student Services, shared that she has been meeting with district staff to review and project special education needs for next school year. That information is then used to project the services and staffing for 2013-14. She also shared that the Focus on Living (FOL) House in Mechanicsburg will be closed next school year. The skills taught in this program can be taught using the Life Skills Lab at Hill Top Academy.
- ➤ Theresa Kinsinger, Director of Business, HR and Communications, invited the Board Members to the Annual CAIU Retiree and Employee Dinner to be held on May 16, 2013. She also shared that a prospective client toured the Lemoyne Office space. She is awaiting information from Szeles Real Estate Development Company regarding a decision from this client.
- ➤ Len Kapp, Supervisor of Operations & Transportation, reported that the Enola HVAC project will be getting underway soon. It is expected that the project will be completed by the end of October or early November.
- ➤ The Capital Area Online Learning Association (CAOLA) has reached a milestone—there are now 1,000 full time cyber students participating in this program. Brian Griffith, Director of Curriculum Services, also shared that the revised Chapter 4 Regulations have been approved. Two key changes affecting our districts are the implementation of the Pennsylvania Common Core Standards and the adoption of high school graduation requirements.
- ➤ The annual Computer Fair will be held on Monday, March 25. David Martin, Director of Technology Services, reported that 135 high school and middle school students will participate from our region's schools. Winners from this computer fair will participate in the state competition.
- Cindy Mortzfeldt, Assistant Executive Director, reported that this is a busy time of year for Federal Programs. School districts and the intermediate unit are updating their 2012-13 federal programs grant applications and preparing for monitoring visits from the Pennsylvania Department of Education.
- ➤ The 2013-14 CAIU General Operating Budget has been approved by a majority of our school districts and by a majority of the weighted votes from our districts. There are several districts that still need to report the results of their Board vote on the budget.
- ➤ The Magic Johnson Bridgescape Academy offers students who have dropped out, or at risk of dropping out of school, the opportunity to earn their high school diploma. Although there have been numerous inquiries from students, there were very few students who enrolled. As a result, it was recommended to the Board to close the program. The CAIU administration will work closely with our partners to terminate any existing agreements.

Preschool Partnership

Our preschool program will be partnering with Shippensburg Head Start program as they apply for a Pre-K Counts grant to serve 72 children from Big Spring and Shippensburg School Districts. This partnership would allow the CAIU to have integrated placements for students with disabilities in the program, allowing for greater inclusionary opportunities in that area.

Sad News about Sawyer, one of the Hill Top Academy Therapy Dogs

This week, Sawyer, one of our Hill Top therapy dogs, passed away rather unexpectedly at the veterinarian's office. Sawyer was 6 years old and was undergoing a surgery for removal of a growth. Preschool Space

We continue to look for appropriate space for four classrooms and therapy rooms for our preschool program in the West Shore area. We have not met with success in obtaining space in school districts and are looking for space to lease.

Evaluative Conciliatory Conference (ECC)

At the February Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) meeting, Cathy Skidmore from the Office of Dispute Resolution presented to district special education contacts about a new resolution process called Evaluative Conciliatory Conference (ECC). This is an option for schools and families who are seeking a resolution to a dispute but who may not want to begin formal due process.

CAEA Announces 2013 Scholarship Program

New Charter Allows Show to go on for CASA

On February 26, Harrisburg School Board of Directors approved the charter application for the Capital Area School for the Arts (CASA) Charter School. The charter proposal was submitted by Capital Region Arts and Education, a non-profit organization founded in Harrisburg to support arts in education.

CASA, located in Strawberry Square in downtown Harrisburg, was formed in 2001 as a partnership between the Capital Area Intermediate Unit (CAIU) and its 24 member school districts to provide accelerated study for grades 9-12 in the areas of visual arts, dance, music, creative writing, theatre, and film and video. In its current model, students attend CASA for arts instruction and return to their home school district for the rest of their academic studies.

In better economic times 17 of the 24 districts paid the full tuition costs for students accepted into the program. Today, only three remaining districts cover the cost of tuition, which is \$5,500 per year.

CASA Charter School will offer a full academic program for grades 9-12. Admission will continue to be contingent on portfolio submission and auditions.

Mobile Device Management

Mobile device (tablets/phones/etc.) utilization has been increasing in school districts. This has challenged school districts to find a cost effective and efficient way to manage the devices. The Technology Advisory Council (TAC) is exploring different regional management solutions. On March 7th, prior to the TAC meeting, districts evaluated three different solutions. We narrowed it down to two solutions and the CAIU is currently working on consortium pricing for our member school districts.

- Attended PAIU Executive Directors meeting and met with PDE staff members and Budget Secretary Zogby. Secretary Zogby discussed the pension plan revisions and its impact on staff
- Participated in the Pennsylvania Association of School Administrators (PASA) Women's caucus in preparation for the conference in May where we will have Dr. Cheri Lovre discuss, "Media Relations for Schools: Crisis Communications."
- Held the third Communications Meeting at Enola where we had 25 employees in the audience with an additional 25 online
- Attended the Superintendent Leadership Conference at Bedford Springs. The focus this year
 was on legal issues, teacher and principal evaluations, and summary of the districts'
 technology and staff development survey
- Attended the American Association of School Administrators (AASA) National Conference on Education in Los Angeles, CA. The title of the conference was, "Where Education Leaders Unite." One of the best presentations was from Charlotte Danielson on "Making the Most of Teacher Evaluation." She discussed her 2013 Evaluation Instrument that is available for free from her website.
