4. Describe the action steps the school/district will take to reduce the opportunity gap in student possession of ASB cards and/or participation in extracurricular activities for the up coming school year.

With COVID-19, sports did not start until the spring of 2021 and prior to that there was uncertainty if there would be any extracurricular activities at all. For this reason, ASB cards were not being sold at the beginning of the school year. In addition, we saw a decrease in free and reduced applications in 2020-21, likely due to meals being provided for free for the entire school year.

We believe the timing of extracurricular activities starting late in the school year and less students identified as free and reduced played a factor into the opportunity gap results. In addition, communication was limited around opportunities for fees to be waived.

In the 2021-22 school year, the district will do the following:

- Include parent consent check box on the 2021-22 F&R applications
- Make F&R applications available to be completed and submitted online.
- Provide information about fee waivers in the athletic registration.
- Provide communications/information about fee waivers at the beginning of the year with the F&R applications.
- Post information about fee waivers on the district website.
