Dear Parents and Carer,

Welcome to an exceptionally different week, to the one that we had expected to experience on Monday, when we arrived into the academy. We firstly had to effectively manage the positive covid cases and the loss of both our students and staff and re-adjust our way of working. Praise and thanks go out to our student, parent and carer community for adapting so swiftly and also to our staff who were teaching remotely, to children self-isolating and also those in the classroom, who were being supported by our staff. On Tuesday, when we believed we could settle down to a working week, the local area had a lengthy and exceptionally disrupted power-cut. The outage was to the extent that the only contact the academy was able to have was via our mobile phones. With all systems down, the decision was made for the students to utilise their mobile phones, in this emergency and to ensure that home was made aware of their imminent departure. Once again, I thank the students for their maturity and staff for their response to support the students during this challenging time.

I am aware of the commentary regarding the use of the students' phones in relation to the forthcoming mobile phone within the academy day, one could acknowledge the irony! However, it will always be our practice that when in an emergency and under exceptional circumstances, as the children and academy found itself to be in, on Tuesday, that the pouches would be released and mobile access assured.

Praise to our Year 10 students as they have worked through their GCSE mock exams, throughout this week. This rehearsal of their forthcoming public examinations will be of great importance to their confidence and understanding of the expectations for their learning in Year 11.

Confirmatory polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test after a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test

LFD tests are most effective when detecting infectious cases of coronavirus. They identify people with a high viral load who are the most likely to spread the virus further. LFDs detect the virus in people without symptoms so each positive case we find is one that would have gone otherwise undetected. These tests are proving to be accurate and reliable and, where used appropriately and in the correct way, they will continue to help us to break chains of the transmission and save lives.s

Anyone who tests positive using an LFD test will be asked to take a confirmatory follow-up PCR test. It remains essential that anyone who gets a positive LFD result self-isolates immediately for 10 days, as well







as the other members of their household. You must only leave home for your follow-up test. You should arrange your confirmatory PCR immediately. For the fastest result, we suggest you book a PCR test at a test site. You can also book a home test online or call 119 to book a test.

A PCR test will confirm if you have been affected by coronavirus or not, and reduce unnecessary self-isolation by you and your household. If you then receive a negative result from the PCR, and the PCR test was taken within 2 days of the LFD, then you and your contacts will be informed you can cease self-isolating.

Individuals who test negative from their LFD will not need to isolate or take a confirmatory test.

- A letter will also be sent via the post service to students registered address this letter will arrive from Friday 13th August.








MFL Live Lessons - message from Miss Sage



Mobile phone ban from Thursday 8th July

We have updated our behaviour policy to reflect the phone ban. These updates can be seen below:

Scenario	What would happen
You have your phone in school but it is in your pouch	Great! You are meeting our expectations. Enjoy your learning ©
You have forgotten your pouch but you give your phone into your pastoral team before 8:50am	We will store you phone safely. You will receive a C3 - Unprepared for Learning (No pen, PE kit, phone pouch or other equipment)
You have your phone on you but it is NOT in it's pouch	You will be asked to put it in its pouch and will attend Learning Recovery for 6 hours.
You have your phone on you but refuse to use your pouch	You will be excluded for a fixed term and then attend Learning Recovery for 6 hours the next day.
You have lost your pouch	Don't bring your phone to school. You can buy replacement pouches for £10

Hastings Opportunity Area – Attendance Matters

A town-wide campaign to support regular school attendance during the last few weeks of term, and in







preparation for the new school year, has been launched by Hastings Opportunity Area (HOA).

All schools and Trusts in Hastings have already signed up to an Attendance Charter that sets out a shared set of principles and practices that all schools will implement to ensure a consistent approach to attendance.

A number of organisations across the town have signed up to the accompanying multi-agency attendance charter, making a commitment to work together with schools to support children and young people attend school, particularly where families may be experiencing barriers to regular school attendance.








Geography work










We know the covid variant is prevalent within the local community, so please remember to send in your child with face coverings and please support everyone by reminding them to wear them (including over the nose!).
