Position Title: Clinical Counselor

**Position Location:** Wingate Main Campus

**Position Summary:** The Clinical Counselor supports the Office of Counseling Services by providing clinical mental health counseling, performing outreach on campus, and consulting with faculty/staff and parents. The Clinical Counselor shares in supervisory responsibilities for counseling interns, performs crisis interventions, and provides mental health trainings to the campus community. This is a full-time, 11-month administrative staff position.

## **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Provide initial assessments, individual, and group therapy to students in accordance with ACA's ethical standards.
- Provide crisis counseling as needed during business hours.
- Possess and demonstrate knowledge of both efficacious and best practices treatment protocol in response to a diverse variety of presenting issues and concerns.
- Provide outreach and consultation services to faculty, staff, parents, and students regarding student well-being and encouraging early referrals and emergency consultations or assessments as needed.
- Offer direct service to the campus community research, design, and teach workshops as needed.
- Supervise graduate-level interns and work with Director of Counseling Services to ensure high quality internship experience
- Ensure counseling records are accurately and confidentially maintained, including the use of files and software databases.

- Possess understanding of mental health-related issues that are common to this setting and population (e.g., stress, depression, anxiety, interpersonal relationship challenges, etc.)
- Assist in training opportunities for faculty, staff, and student groups dealing with mental health needs.

## **Qualifications and Experience:**

- Master's degree in Counseling or a related field is required.
- At least one (1) year work experience, full-time and/or approved internship, conducting clinical interviews, making diagnostic assessments, and formulating treatment or referral plans for individuals with a broad spectrum of psychological problems
- Experience providing individual and/or group counseling, and crisis intervention for counseling emergencies
- Full licensure in North Carolina is preferred.
- One-year post degree experience in college or university setting preferred.
