





Dear Friends.

There is a wonderful documentary movie entitled "Champions of Faith, Baseball Edition." This documentary gives the opportunity for some great All-Stars to share their love of God through their interviews. It is clear that the baseball players also have a deep love of the Catholic Church. This movie, which is available for purchase on DVD, is another reminder of how sports can

be a vehicle for someone to grow in discipline, team work as well as faith in God.

I am not certain of the authorship of the following prayer. The longer version of the prayer provides many examples of how we can mature in our faith through the game of baseball. The shorter version of the prayer makes for a brief prayer that a parent or coach could pray along with their children before a practice or a game. I hope you enjoy it!

BASEBALL PLAYER

God, grant me wisdom, to tell a strike from a ball, to know where to throw and never fall.

Keep me in the base line, running straight and true and I'll look for your sign, to stretch one into two.

Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



Our parish consecration to St. Joseph this past March left me with a much deeper appreciation for and devotion to Jesus' spiritual father, and I am convinced that the graces from that consecration continue to be poured out on

our parish today. You may be familiar with the name 'St. Peter Julian Eymard' from that consecration, as Fr. Calloway often quoted him. St. Peter Julian is actually best known for his deep devotion to the Eucharist. He has written a set of ten devotional volumes. Eight reflect on different aspects of the Eucharist, one is on the Blessed Mother, and one is a collection of reflections on St. Joseph for the month of March.

One of the titles he gives to Mary's spouse is 'St. Joseph, Perpetual Adorer.' Though Joseph was never in the sacramental presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, he adored the real, bodily presence of Jesus as he grew from a child into a man. St. Peter Julian writes: "From His entry into the world, even while still enclosed in Mary's womb as in a living ciborium, Jesus singled out Mary and Joseph to be his adorers. Joseph responded royally." A ciborium is a golden container used to hold the Eucharist. What a beautiful image for our Blessed Mother as she carried Jesus in her womb! Fr. Calloway uses a similar image, calling Mary 'a walking tabernacle.' Joseph was in the true presence of Jesus, hidden in Mary's womb just as we are in the true presence of Jesus when we sit before him hidden in the tabernacle. To further the analogy, this means that the stable where Jesus was born was the first 'adoration chapel,' where Mary and Joseph adored Jesus continually, and others - shepherds and magi - visited to do the same.

St. Joseph spent his life with Jesus. He adored the incarnate Lord, filled with awe, wonder and love. He will teach us to adore that same Jesus in the Eucharist in the same way. Then we may become, in the words of St. Peter Julian "the Joseph of the Eucharist, as he was the Joseph of Nazareth." The U.S. bishops have begun to call for a 'Eucharistic revival' to take place over the next three years. Let us return to our consecration the graces of our to St. Joseph, asking him to teach us to adore the Eucharistic Jesus with silent, awe-struck love.



There is no medal that possesses such power and none so highly esteemed by the Holy Church as the Medal of St. Benedict. Whosoever wears this medal with devotion, trusting to the holy Cross and the merits of the Holy Father, may expect powerful protection in his spiritual and temporal needs.



RAVEN WITH BREAD IN BEAK:

This image represents a second attempt to murder St. Benedict by poisoning his bread, but God sent a raven who carried it off before he could consume it.

HISTORY OF SAINT BENEDICT MEDAL:

The exact time and date of the making of the St. Benedict Medal is not known, but it was formally approved by Pope Benedict XIV in the year 1741. The most common medal today is the Jubilee medal that was struck in the year 1880 in remembrance of the 1400th anniversary of St. Benedict's birth. The letters on the back of the medal has been a mystery until an ancient manuscript was discovered at Metten Abbey in Bavaria in the year 1647, in which an exorcism formula was found that matched the medal's inscriptions. The St. Benedict Medal is one of the oldest and most honored medals used to ward off evil spirits.

FOUR LARGE LETTERS AROUND CROSS: C.S.P.B. (crux sancti Patris Benedict) which is

Latin for, "The cross of the Holy Father Benedict."

LEFT SIDE OF MEDAL:

Encircling the left side of the back of the medal are the letters S.M.Q.L.I.V.B. (Sunt mala quae libas; ipse venena bibas), which is Latin for, "The drink you offer is evil; drink that poison yourself."


Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil.

GROWING THE ORDER

The Foley Council persevered and grew despite the constraints of the pandemic by welcoming 19 new members this past fraternal year (July 2020 - June 2021). This was all possible due to the leadership of the council's Membership Director, Steven Wygonik, and the combined efforts of many Foley Knights to sustain and grow the council. The Supreme Council simplified the process of recruiting new members by combining 3 separate Ceremonies of Charity, Unity and Fraternity into one unified Exemplification. Our district held 3 in-person Exemplification and we welcomed 4 members through these traditional ceremonies. The Supreme Council also offered online Exemplifications due to the social distancing restrictions of the pandemic and this allowed the council to bring in another 9 new Knights. Finally, 6 Knights from other councils recognized the work we are doing at Divine Child and transferred into the Foley Council. Eight of the 19 new Knights were sons of current Foley Knights:

Four Brother Knights transferred into the Foley Council, Benjamin Polak from Old St. Patrick, Brian Peltz from Patrick O'Kelley, **Andrew Schroeder** from National Shrine of the Little Flower, and Edward Plaza from Msgr. Hunt. We are very fortunate to have these 19 new Knights contributing to our efforts to be better Catholic men by strengthen our faith and supporting our families, parish, and community. Meet Our Extended Family:

Martyrs of Scillitan Feast Day July 17 d. 180

The Scillitan Martyrs were a group of twelve North African Christians (seven men and five women) who were executed for their beliefs on July 17, 180. Their names were Speratus, Nartzalus, Cintinus (Cittinus), Veturius, Felix, Aquilinus, Laetantius, Januaria, Generosa, Vestia, Donata, and Secunda. They were an example of the strength and vigor of the Church in Africa in the 2nd century. The martyrs take their name from Scilla (or Scillium), a town in Numidia (present day Algeria). The Acts of the Scillitan Martyrs are considered to be the earliest documents of the Church of

Africa. Speratus, their principal spokesman, wrote that they had lived a quiet and moral life, paying their dues and doing no wrong to their neighbors. However, when called upon to swear and oath to the emperor, they refused. The proconsul of Scillium asked the seven men and five women what has caused them to rebel against worshipping the emperor. They replied, "the books and epistles of Paul, a just man." The emperor was seemingly unimpressed but not particularly upset, and so he gave them thirty days to reconsider and recant, but they all refused. Their trial and execution took place in Carthage under Governor Vigellius Saturninus, who was the first persecutor of Christians in Africa.


