Funding Overview

<u>ARP-ESSER</u>: On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan (ARP).

William Floyd Received: \$25,296,762

Dates to Obligate Funding: March 2020 – September 30, 2024

ARP Application Process: New York State has established a two-part application process for the American Rescue Plan

Part 1: Each school district was required to submit signed assurances to NYSED no later than May 24, 2021. William Floyd's submittal of this process was completed and approved on May 19, 2021.

<u>Part 2</u>: Submit completed application and budget to NYSED. Application and timeline have yet to be determined by NYSED.

- 20% of funds must address learning loss through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, such as summer learning or summer enrichment, extended day, comprehensive afterschool programs, or extended school year programs
- 1% implementation of evidence based summer enrichment programs
- 1% implementation of evidence based comprehensive afterschool programs
- LEA will prioritize spending on non-recurring expenses any programs continuing beyond availability of Federal Funds must identify local funds that will be used to maintain program in order to minimize disruption to core academics





Requirements & Allowable Expenses Cont'd...

- Activities to address the unique needs of low-income children or students, children with disabilities, English language learners, racial and ethnic minorities, students experiencing homelessness, and foster care youth, including how outreach and service delivery will meet the needs of each population
- Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental afterschool programs

- Address the academic impact of lost instructional time through evidence-based interventions
- Address social, emotional and mental health needs
- Reopen schools safe in-person learning based on CDC guidance
- School facility repairs and improvements
