GET TO KNOW THE NEW SUPERINTENDENT



The Northbrook School District 27 Board of Education is pleased to announce it has selected Dr. John Deiter as the District's next Superintendent of Schools. Dr. Deiter officially began his duties on July 1. Dr. Deiter brings extensive experience and leadership in education, having most recently served as the Superintendent of DeWitt Public Schools in DeWitt, Michigan for the past 10 years.

"My greatest strength as a leader is my ability to pull people together to achieve a common goal," Dr. Deiter said. "A collaborative attitude and atmosphere are crucial for a successful

organization. I was drawn to District 27 because of its strong sense of community. I am excited to have the opportunity to work closely with the staff, Board of Education, and community to continue a tradition of excellence in Northbrook."

Prior to serving as the Superintendent of Schools in DeWitt, Dr. Deiter spent six years as principal in Belding Area Schools and two years as principal in Ionia Public Schools. He holds a bachelor's degree in Education from Central Michigan University and a master's degree in secondary teaching from Saginaw Valley State University. He obtained his Ph.D. in Educational Administration from Michigan State University. Dr. Deiter has six years of classroom teaching experience. He has served as president of the School Equity Caucus since 2014 and was president of the Michigan Association of Superintendents & Administrators Region 6 from 2017-2018.

Q&A WITH DR. JOHN DEITER

Q: Tell us more about what drew you to District 27?

A: I was first drawn by the location, but was sold on District 27 when I learned about the people and the community. The close-knit, high-performing staff, the supportive community, and especially the talented students are what really drew me in.


SHABONEE STUDENTS CELEBRATE EARTH DAY, COLLECT TRASH


