Student Academic Support Opportunities @ The Williams Center at Mt. Greylock

Since 2008, the *Williams Center at Mt. Greylock* (WC) has engaged college students, professors and resources throughout the Mt. Greylock curriculum and beyond alongside our faculty partners at MG. During this COVID period of distance learning, we will continue to provide free academic support both during and after the school day for those students in the most need of extra assistance.

The MGRS Library Media Center is now the official home of the **Williams Center**. Our School-Based Coordinator and Librarian, **Liza Barrett**, will facilitate and schedule these programs; inquiries should be directed to her. **All Williams Center programs are free, but many require a one-time completion of the '20-21 WC @ MG Remote Learning Contract available from lbarrett@mgrhs.org.**

- After-school Homework Help@MG: After-school homework help is available for students in grades 7-9. Williams Fellows work one-on-one or in small subject groups with students on homework and study skills in all academic areas. This program is supervised by Mrs. Barrett and is offered on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 2:30 4:00 pm. It requires a signed contract and advance registration and sign-up.
- Free High School Evening Tutoring for Grades 10-12: Williams Fellows will run remote weekly one-on-one or small group sessions with Mt. Greylock students in subject-specific areas. This program also requires the contract, and advance registration and sign-up, but is not supervised on-line
- Writing Fellows Program/College Essay Coaching: Williams students provide free, one-on-one, online feedback and coaching to Mt. Greylock seniors on their personal college essays aor ANY essay. The Williams Fellows support our high school students through one-on-one dialogue and revision-based editing. We encourage all MG students to email one of these four talented and dedicated Writing Fellows ANYTIME for essay support! College and/or essay Coaching appointments will be self scheduled by MG students and will not be monitored on-line. Contact Liza Barrett for more information.
