To the Class of 2021 and Parents/Guardians:

As you begin the second half of your high school education, it is important to effectively plan your educational future. Enclosed is information we hope will be helpful in this process, including the Calendar for Juniors that guides you through the post-secondary planning process and helps you meet essential upcoming deadlines.

We strongly encourage all juniors to take the PSAT at Mount Greylock on <u>Saturday</u>, October 19. The deadline for signing up for this exam is Wednesday, October 16, 2019. The PSAT is a preliminary or practice version of the SAT required by a vast majority of college admissions offices. When students sign up (\$21.00 cash or check payable to MGRSD) for the PSAT in the guidance office, they will receive a PSAT Student Bulletin that is full of test taking tips and strategies, as well as sample questions and a sample test. Sign up immediately!

Berkshire Community College is hosting a National College Fair on Wednesday, October 2. The College Fair is a good opportunity as you're thinking about post-secondary options. Over 100 college representatives as well as military recruiters will be on hand to provide information about their programs. Juniors are encouraged to join the Guidance Office on a field trip to the college fair from 9am-11am. A \$6 bus fee and signed permission is required to attend. Space is limited on a first come first serve basis so hand in your fee and slip as soon as possible. Last day to sign up is Monday, September 30th.

<u>College Rep Visits</u>: Over 60 colleges are visiting Mount Greylock this fall. Juniors are welcome to attend, and will have the opportunity to meet the individual that will answer questions and perhaps read their application senior year, so come and make a great first impression. A list of college visits is noted in this packet. To sign up to meet with a college rep, visit Guidance to fill out a Yellow permission form to be excused from class.

We also invite you and your child to visit the <u>College and Career Center</u> located in the Guidance Office. Career options, college and military information, including videos, catalogs and viewbooks, are available to help in your research.

AP COURSE REMINDER: Every student taking an AP course is required to take the AP exam in May. The fee is **\$94 per exam** and registration is due by November 15th. More information will be forthcoming regarding how to register this year.

Please note it is important to concentrate on raising your GPA junior year as colleges rely heavily on your academic progress this year. Tutoring is a great option to help boost your grades. See your counselor regarding what might work for you. Do not he sitate to contact the guidance office if you have questions about the enclosed material or if we can be of help in any way.

We will begin meeting with your Juniors mid year to discuss the college process and post-secondary options. A parent presentation will be held in the spring.

## JUNIOR YEAR CALENDAR

#### **SEPTEMBER**

- Review your high school courses. (Keep in mind college requirements.)
- Register for the PSAT in the guidance office (register by Oct. 16). The test is <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 19</u>. Bring \$21.00 payable to MGRSD or in cash to Ms. Tierney in Guidance.
- Read PSAT/NMSQT Student Bulletin and take practice exam.
- Get involved in activities; genuine involvement in one is better than token participation in several.
- Check announcements for colleges that are visiting Mount Greylock and fill out a yellow permission form that's found in Guidance.

#### **OCTOBER**

- Read PSAT/NMSQT Student Bulletin and take practice exam.
- ◆ Take PSAT/NMSQT exam on October 19.
- Obtain your Social Security number (you'll need it for college applications).
- ♦ Develop a list of your interests.
- Meet with college representatives as they visit MGRHS throughout the school year. Sign up in Guidance.

#### **NOVEMBER**

- Begin to involve your parents in the college choice process.
- Put forth your best academic effort in these last two years.

#### **DECEMBER**

- Review your PSAT scores and develop a strategy for SAT preparation.
- Read <u>Taking the SAT</u> bulletin available in the guidance office.
- ◆ Talk with graduates who are home from college.

#### **JANUARY**

- Talk with your counselor about your initial college interests.
- Prepare for semester exams; colleges weigh heavily on your junior grades, and your junior year is your last opportunity to raise your GPA.

#### **FEBRUARY**

- ♦ Plan senior year courses.
- Attend college/career planning groups with your guidance counselor.
- ♦ Begin the college search.

#### MARCH

- Attend college/career planning groups with your guidance counselor.
- Register for May and/or June SAT Reasoning or SAT Subject tests at collegeboard.org
- Ask your counselor about summer enrichment programs.
- ♦ Discuss your senior schedule with your counselor.

#### **APRIL**

- Develop a preliminary list of colleges that interest you and begin making contacts.
- ♦ Plan visits to colleges that interest you.
- ♦ Take the ACT in April and/or register for the June SAT
- File service academy and ROTC scholarship applications.

#### <u>MAY</u>

- Attend local college fairs.
- ♦ Identify teachers you can ask for recommendations.
- Take the SAT Reasoning or SAT Subject test.
- ♦ Register for the June ACT
- Make a profile of colleges that interest you; use Naviance, Barron's, <u>The College Handbook</u>, college catalogs, and other resources available in the guidance office and College and Career Center.

#### JUNE

- ♦ Take June ACT or SAT Reasoning/SAT Subject Test
- Continue the college search and discuss choices with your counselor.
- Plan summer visits to colleges.
- If you do not have a job, try volunteering in a career area in which you are interested.

#### COLLEGE FAIR INFORMATION

#### STUDENTS, PARENTS!!

The following suggestions should help in getting the most out of this event:

- ♦ DO YOUR HOMEWORK. Keep in mind the criteria you are using for selecting a college (geographic location, size, programs, financial aid, academic requirements, admissions criteria) and narrow your choices before you arrive. You can't visit all 150 schools.
- ♦ HAVE PERTINENT ACADEMIC INFORMATION WITH YOU. Know your average and PSAT or SAT scores. If you have an idea which program you wish to study, mention that as well.
- ♦ DON'T BE AFRAID TO ASK QUESTIONS. College counselors are there to assist you with your planning and look forward to questions. Nothing you say at this program will be used to determine whether or not you are accepted at a particular college. Make the most of this by asking what you need to know.
- ♦ MAKE IT A FAMILY AFFAIR. Bring your parents along. They need not accompany you from table to table. You can discuss with them beforehand what you want to find out and which colleges you want to visit, and then split your list with them and go separate ways. This way you can get information about more colleges. Or you may want to visit the same colleges separately so that you can compare notes later on.
- ♦ KEEP AN OPEN MIND. Don't neglect a college because you have "never heard of it." One reason for a college fair is to introduce you to institutions that may meet your needs very well but you might not have learned about on your own.
- ◆ FOLLOW UP ON WHAT YOU LEARN. Discuss with your guidance counselor what you plan to do next and ask their advice. Counselors can verify the feasibility of your choices, tell you about application procedures and deadlines, write letters of recommendation, and assist you throughout the process.

#### PRE-COLLEGE FAIR GUIDE

The College Fairs will afford students, parents and educators a fine opportunity to receive first-hand information regarding many institutions of higher education. Participation in a fair will be very helpful to students and their parents as they engage in the process of selecting an appropriate institution of higher education. A College Fair is an ideal event for fact finding in-depth in a short space of time.

<u>Prior</u> to attending a College Fair, it is important that students give some thought to the type of further education that they might care to pursue. See your high school counselor and visit the College and Career Center <u>prior</u> to a fair to discuss your thoughts regarding postsecondary options. They have reference materials that will be helpful in this exploratory process. <u>Prior</u> to the fair, students should select at least two or three institutions and plan to meet with their representatives.

The following guidelines may be helpful to students as they think through the questions they would like to ask the various representatives that are available at the fair. Students should make notes and write out questions that they desire to have answered. Students should feel free to take these notes with them to the fair.

# Sample Questions to Ask College Representatives at a College Fair

- What internship opportunities are available in my major?
- What is your admissions criteria?
- How many students attend this school without a major in mind? (Undecided)
- Do you have special requirements for admission for certain majors?
- What types of jobs or graduate schools do students attend after they graduate?
- Could you review your financial aid deadlines and necessary forms to apply for financial aid?
- What services does your career planning office provide?
- What academic support does your college offer (ex: tutoring, writing center, math support) and is it free?
- How do I become involved in the honors program?
- How many students will be in my first year courses?
- Are freshman courses taught by full-time faculty or by graduate assistants?
- What kinds of work-study jobs are available?
- What is the retention rate at this school?
- Does this school offer study abroad programs?
- What types of things do students do on the weekend?
- · What is the culture like on campus?
- Do many students go home or away for the weekend?
- What's there to do on campus on the weekend?
- What percentage of students receive financial aid and what does the typical package look like?
- Do you have any campus traditions?
- · How do you apply for school specific scholarships?
