West Bloomfield School District Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan Educational Goal Progress as described in Section 98a (MCL 388.1698a)

In order to receive state aid under Section 98a (MCL 388.1698a), Michigan school districts must provide for instruction under an extended COVID-19 Learning Plan that has been approved by an intermediate district or authorized body. Additionally, by or before the last day of school, school districts are required to create a report concerning progress made in meeting educational goals that include pupil achievement and/or student growth via benchmark assessments that are aligned to state standards.

This report, which was presented to the West Bloomfield School District Board of Education on June 7th, 2021, provides a detailed review of student progress in our school district in three key areas--achievement, attendance, and discipline infractions. As noted in this report, the West Bloomfield School District is proud to report some positive signs of student achievement amidst some very difficult circumstances. At the same time, we know those positive signs are not enough. There is more work to be done. We are prepared and eager to take critical next steps to help increase student achievement. These next steps will include data-driven district improvement goals, with a true commitment to meeting students where they are at, creating a sense of authentic belonging, and supporting the whole child every step of the way. Above all else, the district will continue to pursue a bold Portrait of a Graduate vision where all students are impactful Collaborators, Critical Thinkers, Contributors, and Communicators.
