Enrolling in Westport Community Schools Acceptable Proof of Residence

Before any student is enrolled in Westport Community Schools, the student's parent or legal guardian must prove legal residence in the Town of Westport. Families whose primary residence is outside the Town of Westport are not eligible to attend Westport Community Schools. Effective July 1, 2009, all applicants must submit at least three proofs of residency. Documents must be presented at the time of registration. The school district may photocopy these documents for our records, but any photocopies made will not include any financial information, such as bank account, credit account numbers and/or balances, or Social Security numbers.

Families who cannot provide these documents may appeal to the Superintendent to discuss their unique circumstances. This residency policy does not apply to homeless students and families.

Westport Community Schools does not accept the following documents as proof of residency: undated and/or unsigned lease or rental agreements; magazines, newspapers, catalogues or any mail addressed to "current resident;" shut-off notices, collection notices or tax lien notices.
