

Return to Regular School Schedules

- ▶ First Day of School for K-8 is August 25
- ▶ First Day of School for Preschool is August 26
- Normal hours of operation for Palos East & Palos West
 - * 8:55 a.m. to 3:25 p.m.
- Normal hours of operation for Palos South
 - * 8:15 a.m. to 2:40 p.m.
 - ❖ Zero Hour will run from 7:29 a.m. to 8:12 a.m.
 - Activity buses reinstated for after school programs
- ▶ Late Start Wednesday for all schools starting September 1 (30 mins.)

Full Day Kindergarten and Ivy League

- Tuition based full-day kindergarten program will be offered.
- Free half-day kindergarten program will be available to all.
 - * Full-Day Kindergarten hours are 9:15 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
 - * AM Kindergarten hours are 9:15 a.m. to 11:45 a.m.
 - ❖ PM Kindergarten hours are 12:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- ▶ Ivy League Before & After School programs will be offered at both elementary schools onsite.

Student Movements

- Palos South students will switch classes at the beginning of the school year.
- Palos East and Palos West students will switch classes for specials, intervention services, math enrichment and ALPS at identified grades.
- Media Centers will be open.
- Cubbies and lockers will be utilized next school year.

Lunch & Recess

- ▶ Lunch program and recess will be reinstated next school year.
- ▶ Lunches may be served in lunchrooms and/other large areas.
- Due to the continued expansion of enhanced NSLP benefits, lunches will be offered to all students at no cost to families.
- ▶ Playgrounds will be open at Palos East and Palos West.

Fine Arts & Athletics

- ▶ Elementary and Middle School Band will be reinstated.
- Middle school Drama and after school extracurricular activities will be reinstated.
- SWIC competitive sports will resume next school year.

Transitioning All Students to In-Person

- Additional sections have been added to reduce class size to accommodate all students returning to in-person learning.
- All schools will have two social workers to assist transitioning students.
- Joint Principal Advisory Council met to make recommendations for transitioning students back to in-person.
- A final plan is being developed with input from parents, teachers, social workers, middle school guidance counselor, administrators and mental health professionals.

Transitioning All Students to In-Person


- Staff professional development on trauma informed practices.
- ▶ Tier support for students:
 - School visits prior to the start of school year
 - ▶ Rhithm emotional check-in app
 - ▶ Lunch bunch groups & peer buddy systems
 - ▶ Transition plans to meet individual needs
- ▶ Solicit suggestions from remote families via survey.

Current Public Health Mandates

5 Current Mandates for SY21-22 (Subject to Change)

*The School Board <u>**DOES NOT</u>** have the authority to ignore or discretion to modify these 5 public health mandates.</u>

- 1. Face masks are required for all students, staff and visitors.
 - ► Governor's Executive Order 2020-47 (June 1, 2021)
 - Regardless of vaccination status
- 2. Social distancing of 3 ft. with masks and 6 ft. without masks.
 - ▶ Mask can be removed when eating and outside.
 - ► Regardless of vaccination status

Current Public Health Mandates

- 3. Contact tracing and quarantines for positive cases and unvaccinated close contacts.
 - Vaccinated close contacts are no longer required to quarantine.
- 4. Increased school-wide cleaning and disinfecting.
- 5. Promotion and adherence to handwashing.

*The School Board <u>DOES NOT</u> have the authority to ignore or discretion to modify these 5 public health mandates.

What is NOT Mandated for SY21-22

- 1. COVID-19 vaccinations
- Remote learning programs (except for students ineligible to receive a vaccination AND under quarantine by a local health department)

Changes for SY21-22 based on current guidance and COVID stats.

- No temperature checks upon arrival at school.
 - > No longer recommended by IDPH.
- 2. No daily Symptom Check Self Certification forms (yellow).
 - Parents will continue to monitor student health and be required to keep symptomatic students at home.
- 3. No middle school student cohorts ("pods").
 - Surrounding middle schools have switched classes without incident.
- 4. Allowing the use of shared materials/equipment.
 - Risk is generally low from contact with contaminated surface (CDC). Hand hygiene is an appropriate mitigation strategy.

Changes for SY21-22 based on current guidance and COVID stats.

- 5. Discontinue whole class quarantines.
 - No students quarantined as close contacts reported a positive COVID-19 diagnosis as a result of classroom transmission.
 - Only close contacts as defined by IDPH will be quarantined.
 - Quarantined students will have the opportunity to check-in with classroom teacher(s) daily during quarantine.
 - We anticipate significantly fewer quarantines and continue to explore how to best support quarantined students.

Big Unknowns for SY21-22

- Changes to current 5 public health mandates.
- > IDPH Exclusion Mandates
 - Definition of Close Contact
 - ♦ 6 ft. vs. 3 ft.?
 - Quarantine Duration
 - ❖ From 14 days to 10 days to ?
 - Quarantine Support
 - Mandated support for students under quarantine?

Question:

Will students be required to wear a face mask next school year?

Answer:

A mask mandate for students and staff remains in effect for SY21-22 but is subject to change.

Question:

Will Palos South students be switching classes next year?

Answer:

Yes, Palos South students will begin the school year switching classes.

Question:

Will next school year be full days?

Answer:

Yes. We will return to full days next school year.

Question:

Does the school district have a plan for transitioning all students back to in-person instruction?

Answer:

Yes. A robust plan is being developed with input from parents, teachers, social workers, middle school guidance counselor, administrators and mental health professionals.

Question:

Does my child need to be vaccinated in order to attend inperson instruction?

Answer:

No. All students will be returning to in-person instruction regardless of vaccination status.

Question:

If my child has a medical condition, can he/she enroll in a remote learning program next school year?

Answer:

If you are concerned about in-person learning based on your child's medical condition, please contact the Student Services Department at 708-761-5807.

Question:

Will lunch be served daily?

Answer:

Due to the extension of expanded NSLP benefits, boxed lunches will be provided at no charge.

Question:

Will in-person sports, extracurricular activities and band return next year?

Answer:

Yes
