Essential Question: How can one use music to explore, understand, and assert an authentic voice?

Course Description: This is a very exciting course that is currently under construction, but here is what we are working towards:

This course will delve into the roots of three major musical movements in the United States: Blues, Jazz, and Hip Hop. We will explore the conditions that led to them; how they express experiences and/or values; what was ingenious about the movements as they began; and what lessons we can learn from them now. We will do this through inquiry, research, reading, text analysis, guest presentations by local jazz and recording artists, and field trips.

The hands-on aspects of our course will involve creating music with the program Soundtrap, writing lyrics, and developing cover art for our creations. All of this will lead up to our culminating event which will include a class-created album of student songs, student-created cover art, and informative writing (liner notes) connecting our music and the historical development of the movements we studied.

Prerequisites: None

Method of Instruction: Inquiry, research, independent reading, text analysis, discussion, writing, and hands-on experiences.
