





## St. Mary Magdalene - Feast Day, July 22

When you read or hear in the Scriptures about the resurrection of Jesus Christ, do you imagine what the disciples must have thought or how they felt when they saw the empty Tomb of Christ? Or what about Mary Magdalene who was one of his followers and witnessed the crucifixion?

She is mentioned in all four Gospel accounts in relation to the resurrection of Jesus. How interesting! The four do not mention that the apostles or other disciples were the first to see the empty tomb where the body of Jesus was placed after his crucifixion. They were informed later by Mary of Magdala and the women who were with her. In Matthew, Mark, and Luke, we learn that Mary Magdalene and women with her discover the empty tomb and see angels informing them that the Lord Jesus had been raised. He is not there.

However, in the Gospel of John 20:11-18, after Mary of Magdala saw the empty tomb and ran to tell Peter and the apostles, she returned to the tomb and wept. Jesus appears to her, although she thought it was the gardener; she was deep in sorrow.

It wasn't until she heard her name **Mary** called out, when she turned and saw Jesus. She then went and told the disciples: I have seen the Lord!







### Family Fun! Backyard Olympics

Friendly competition teaches children about teamwork and how to be a gracious winner or loser. Before starting your backyard Olympics, consider holding an opening ceremony and ask Olympians to take an oath of good sportsmanship like athletes do at the Olympic Games.

Also consider creating paper medals for the events. Some event ideas:

- **Running Long Jump:** With a running start, see who can jump the farthest from a line marked on the ground.
- **Relay Race:** Use a stick or baton to hand off between runners while they go on a designated path. If you don't have enough runners for a race, have participants race to beat their own time.
- No Water Synchronized Swimming: Have groups pick music and choreograph a short routine to see how in sync they can stay.
- **Balance Beam:** Paint a straight, even stripe on a flat section of lawn, which is the "balance beam." Ask participants to perform a series of increasing difficult maneuvers without straying from the stripe. Award points for completion of each maneuver. Some fun suggestions include: walking forward, walking backward, hopping on one foot, doing front rolls or cartwheels.
- Hula-hoop-a-thon: Kids keep their hoops moving as long as possible and are eliminated when their hoops touch the ground.
- Discus: See who can throw a frisbee the farthest distance.
- Water Balloon Shot Put: See who can throw a water balloon the farthest.
- Pool Noodle Javelin: Each child gets three attempts to see who can throw his or her pool noodle the farthest.

### Meet Our Extended Family:

#### St. Sebastian Feast Day January 20 C.256 - January 20, 287


According to legend, Sebastian was born at Narbonne, Gaul. He became a soldier in the Roman army and encouraged two Christians, Marcellian and Marcus, under sentence of death, to remain firm in their faith. Sebastian made numerous converts: among them were Nicostratus, who was in charge of prisoners and his wife, Zoe, a deaf mute whom he cured: the jailer Claudius: Chromatius. Prefect of Rome, whom he cured of gout; and Chromatius' son, Tiburtius. After Chromatius was healed, he set the prisoners free, freed his slaves and resigned as prefect.

Sebastian was captain in the praetorian guards during the reign of Emperors Diocletian and Maximian. Neither knew that Sebastian was a Christian, but when it was discovered that he was a Christian, he was ordered to be executed. He was shot with arrows and left for dead, but when the widow of St. Castulus went to recover his body, she found he was still alive and nursed him back to health. Soon after, Sebastian intercepted the Emperor, denounced him for his cruelty to Christians, and was beaten to death on the Emperor's orders.

St. Sebastian is the patron saint of athletes because of his physical endurance and his energetic way of spreading and defending the Faith.

Despite a disappointing history on abortion, the American Medical Association states in its Code of Medical Ethics Opinion 5.8, "Euthanasia is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer...and would pose serious societal risks. Euthanasia could readily be extended to incompetent patients and other vulnerable populations." During the pandemic, questions were raised about multiple patients in Canada who were isolated from family members in guarantined facilities with mental faculties incapable of providing informed consent being euthanized. ### Anointing of the Sick

Please call the Rectory Office to request this Sacrament. In emergency situations when the office is closed, the emergency line attendant will take the call.

### **Baptisms**

Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a **Baptism class** prior to the Baptism. The Church requires that at least one of the parents and one of the godparents/sponsors be practicing Catholics; that is, they attend Mass each weekend.

### <u>Marriages</u>

Arrangements must be made <u>at least</u> six months in advance and couple must be active, registered members at a Catholic Church. <u>Potential wedding date is not confirmed until couple meets with a Divine Child priest</u>. Officiant at the ceremony will be a priest from Divine Child unless the couple has someone close to them who is a Catholic priest. Music for the liturgy <u>must</u> be coordinated with our Director of Music Ministry, Mr. Matthew Simpson.

### **Funerals**

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. *Memorial Masses* are scheduled Monday-Friday <u>only</u>.

Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory Office. Please call Alicia Reyes at 313-277-3110.
