#### **Dear Parents and carers**

I do hope, as always, that this finds you all very well and that you have had a very productive and successful week. As I write our staff are very busy restoring the academy to its former pastoral glory, where, on Monday, our pastoral team will be greeting their tutees who will once more belong to a community, that of East Hill, West Hill, Silverhill and Firehills. We are so excited about this and cannot wait to return to a normal that we have all missed. Our students were presented with an assembly by Mr Snelling, this week and they know what entrance to take and will learn their new classrooms to move to. Next week is the start of our new beginning and we are so pleased to be able to make this a reality, for our students.

Albeit we are returning to our pastoral houses, we are still very mindful of the fact that the covid virus is within our local community. In collaboration with the University of Brighton Academies Trust, the academy has carefully considered the changes in government guidance, as below.

# Monday 19th July

Government guidance for schools states that whilst restrictions may be lifted from Monday, 19 July 2021, we remain cautious in our approach to ensure as many students remain able to enjoy their education safely whilst trying to reduce the risk of unnecessary isolation during their last week of term and into the start of the summer holidays.

As a result, please see our key headlines for the remainder of this term (subject to no further changes to government guidance for schools).

# The headlines arrangements until the end of term are:

- Drop off and pick-up arrangements remain the same.
- In line with government policy, the academy will no longer strongly encourage all parents/carers to wear face coverings when dropping off and collecting your child. It remains, however, a personal choice for all adults on site to wear or not to wear a mask and we will not be removing our face-covering signs.
- Classroom layouts has greater flexibility.

# What has been explained to the students?

• The students have been informed that they are to continue to keep themselves and others safe,







whilst continuing to enjoy their learning.

• The students, as advised, have been told that there may be changes to their classrooms and pastoral communities

# Will the academy be involved in contact tracing?

- The academy may still be contacted by health protection teams to "help with identifying close contacts" if there is an 'outbreak' of covid-19 in the setting. Therefore, children may still be required to self-isolate for up to 10 days. Remote learning will remain available.
- It is only from 16 August 2021 that the government states children under 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are identified as a close contact of a positive covid-19 case. Instead, they will be advised to take a PCR test.

# Will the classroom layouts be any different from Monday, 19 July 2021?

- From Monday, 19 July 2021, there is no longer a requirement for students to sit in rows facing forward.
- The sharing of more equipment is permitted

# Will the academy continue to support the children in understanding hygiene measures to keep themselves and others as safe as possible during the school day?

- Building on current measures in place within the academy, <u>hand washing will remain a vital and a regular part of your child's school day</u>. Students will still be expected to clean their hands on entry, before and after break, before lunch and after lunch This is a minimum expectation.
- Staff will continue to teach and regularly remind their students about handwashing
- Catch it, Bin it, Kill it will be reinforced throughout the school day. Each classroom will continue to have a lidded bin to support this.
- A comprehensive cleaning schedule remains in place.

# What are the arrangements from September 2021?

# Testing of students in the autumn term at The Hastings Academy

- Following the announcements on Step 4, we will be testing all students, who complete/have completed the consent form, at our on-site asymptomatic test site (ATS), at the academy, on return following the summer holidays. This approach is based on the latest public health advice and will help us break chains of transmission in our setting after the summer holidays when our students may have been mixing with lots of people. We have been asked that these tests are carried out on site as testing participation rates amongst students via ATS are much higher than when testing at home.
- We will be reviewing the number of consent forms completed by our parents and carers, on Monday, which will enable us to create an informed testing schedule and expected staggered start for each year group, at the start of the term
- A separate parent/carer guidance detailing this information will be sent out before the end of term outlining key information about the start of the September term

We are also asking that you encourage and ensure your children are continuing to twice-weekly test at home for the rest of this term and in the autumn, following the two initial on-site tests. All our education workforce will also continue to test – twice-weekly at home – on return in the autumn term. We will review the continued need for testing, based on public health advice at the end of September, as advised by the DFE.







The measures we will have after summer, including testing, strike the right balance as we learn to live with the virus so our children can continue in face-to-face education and we will advise of the expectations and timetable for our safe and timely re-entry into the academy, for both testing and beginning the next phase of our children's education.

#### New household account feature for parents reporting test results -Information from the DFE

NHS Test and Trace are continuing to develop and improve the process for self-test reporting. Currently, as a parent or carer if you are submitting results through your account on behalf of your child, you have to enter the child's details every time you report a result.

As a result of feedback from parents and carers, NHS Test and Trace have introduced household accounts. This allows parents and carers to save your children's details to your own user accounts so you can report results for multiple members in your household more quickly and easily.

When reporting self-test results parents and carers will now be offered the opportunity to create a household account, which should take no more than 2 minutes. Parents and carers can then add all household members to your account, enabling you to save time when reporting all future self-test results.

Even though I have to reference again the protective measures that we continue to adhere to, I feel this is a necessary evil as we all continue to care for each other with safe and respectful practices. Once again, I praise our students who have engaged with us and worn their face coverings, throughout this challenging time.

#### **Head Student and Senior Student applications**
