PANGBOURNE COLLEGE FEES 2021/2022

Fees are reviewed annually, with any changes taking place at the beginning of each academic year. Any changes are normally notified to parents a term in advance.

Registration Fee

A non-refundable registration fee of £100 (£150 for those living outside the UK) is payable when a pupil is first registered for entry. This ensures that the pupil will be considered for entry and called forward for assessment at the appropriate time.

Acceptance Deposit

Following an offer to join Pangbourne College, a non-refundable deposit of £1,000 is required in order to confirm your child's place. The deposit for pupils outside the UK is £12,680 equivalent to one term's boarding fees.

Educational and Boarding Fees

Fees are charged termly in advance and are inclusive of all the normal maintenance and recreational requirements of each pupil. Also included in the fees are: Academic lessons and most text books; accommodation for boarders; sports coaching; lunch and snacks (plus breakfast and dinner for boarders); laundry (not day pupils); pastoral support from Housemaster and Tutor; a full time Chaplaincy; access to ICT and the internet; a 230 acre site, including riverside access, for outdoor activities; extensive co-curricular programme; plays and concerts in the Drake Hall; music rehearsal facilities; transport to matches; accommodation for private study; careers advice; personal accident insurance.

The fees for the **2021-2022** academic year are:

Senior (Years 9-13)

Full Boarder - £38,040 per annum (£12,680 per term) - 7 nights per week

Weekly Boarder - £34,530 per annum (£11,510 per term) – up to 6 nights per week

Part Boarder - £33,180 per annum (£11,060 per term) – 4 nights per week: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday plus Saturday prior to College Sundays, if required

Day - £25,620 per annum (£8,540 per term)

Junior (Years 7-8)

Full Boarder - £27,150 per annum (£9,050 per term) – 7 nights per week

Weekly Boarder - £24,630 per annum (£8,210 per term) – up to 6 nights per week

Part Boarder - £23,730 per annum (£7,910 per term) – 4 nights: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday

Day - £18,900 per annum (£6,300 per term)

Methods of Payment

Fees are paid by direct debit on the first day of term (the direct debit collection date is indicated on the bill). There is also a scheme for a lump sum advance payment. **Details are available through the Bursary, telephone +44(0)118 984 2101**

Notice Period

A full term's notice, in writing, is required before a pupil is withdrawn from the College or fees will be due in lieu of notice. A full term's notice, in writing, is also required for a change in boarding/weekly boarding or part-boarding status or fees may be due in lieu of notice.

Overnight Stays

On an availability basis, day pupils may stay in College overnight and Part-Boarding pupils may stay more than four nights a week. These overnight stays should not exceed 10 nights per year without incurring a change in boarding status and are charged as follows:

Senior	£55 per night
Junior	£40 per night

Day pupils are able to opt for Breakfast and Supper for a charge £5.00 for each meal. Bookings should be made via their respective Housemaster/Housemistress.

Optional and Additional Charges

So far as is possible "extras" are kept to a minimum but additional charges will be made for exams, some school textbooks and some extra-curricular activities e.g. Boat Club, riding and Duke of Edinburgh/CCF participation. In addition there are a number of optional activities and items that may result in additional charges. The main ones are listed below and full details are published in the Parents' Handbook.

Trunk Leavers

Boarders may opt to leave their personal belongings at the College during the school holidays and have their laundry completed before the start of the following term. There is a charge for this of £80 and bookings should be made via their respective Housemaster/Housemistress.

House Levy/ Divisional Subscription

Many social activities and events arranged by the school or individual houses are free. However pupils are required to contribute £15 per term towards House Funds. Some social activities may be recharged e.g. offsite events such as paintballing, day trips, cinema trips. These will always be notified in advance and permission sought.
