A progressive school

Progressive education is about putting children, and their voices, at the center of their learning.

Gordon recognizes that children come into school with important knowledge, understandings, relationships, values, and backgrounds. A progressive curriculum and pedagogy honors students' questions and their experiences. At Gordon, children are not empty vessels to be filled with information. Instead, teachers use what they hear and observe to shape the curriculum.

Gordon builds an authentic sense of curiosity, awe, and wonder in children. They are not simply pursuing learning for an external reward or motivation. They're doing it because they want to understand the world. At age three, Gordon students pose and answer questions they've never seen before. The greatest accomplishment of Gordon's progressive education is that their learning remains relevant, and the fourteen-year-olds are still asking new questions, and finding answers for themselves.

Gordon was founded in 1910 by pediatrician Dr. Helen West Cooke as the *Open Air School.* Windows were kept open year round to encourage good health and clear thinking. Today, ample time to play in that fresh air is still a daily priority.

Both indoors and out, there remains a schoolwide commitment to supporting healthy social, emotional, and physical development. Experiential education, movement breaks and mindfulness practices enhance classroom learning. Robust health and wellness, physical education and after school athletics programs complement unstructured outdoor recess. Student fitness and growth are treated holistically, in the spirit of Gordon's founding belief that "mind and heart should be educated with equal care."

Social and emotional learning

Children learn best when they know how to manage their feelings and personal relationships. Gordon addresses this reality head-on with a social curriculum that begins on day one of a Nursery student's Gordon journey, a physical education program that prioritizes smart responses to emotional situations, and health classes that begin in third grade.

Social and emotional strategies, like any skill, take practice. Gordon students do this work in the classroom, through direct instruction and a multicultural approach to learning that asks students to know themselves well and to consider the perspectives and experiences of others. The result is students who are empowered to self advocate, have open and honest discussions, and make choices that are right for them.

The Gordon journey

Early Childhood

(Nursery to Kindergarten) A play-based program that harnesses joyful curiosity to build foundational skills and instill a love of learning

The inspiring, age-appropriate curriculum facilitates social and emotional growth and challenges students intellectually. Children venture beyond their classroom to learn from specialists in the fields of music, art, library, physical education, and Spanish.

Lower School

(first to fourth grade) An engaging learning experience that sets the stage for academic and social success

In Lower School, students widen their worlds, sharpening their skills on increasingly complex topics in math, science and humanities. In small groups, as a class, and as a grade, they begin to discover their own strengths as collaborators, and to practice advocating for themselves and others.

Middle School (fifth to eighth grade)

A dynamic and intensive program that challenges students to take responsibility for their own success in the classroom

By Middle School, students are continually applying their classroom learning to real-world events and experiences. The curriculum gives each student a chance to shine, honing their individual voice and helping them find their own path to leadership.
