A phoenix rises from the ashes in the center of the Woodhull flag to represent the house burning to the ground in 1892. The phoenix represents Woodhull's resiliency and ability to fight on despite all odds. Some Woodhull traditions include The Muffler game, an annual football game in which Woodhull and Griswold compete for the muffler that fell off of Rabbi Levy's car during a similar football game in '97. Woodhull also hosts the annual formal Wood Tea and the pre-Hill Week Haka, a traditional intimidation dance originating from the Maori tribe of New Zealand.
