Dear Parents,

On behalf of the JSerra faculty, staff, and administration, we welcome you to the 2022-23 school year. "Become who God made you to be" has been chosen as our rallying cry for the young women and men of Lion Nation as we open our doors and hearts to them in August. We see in each of our students the beauty of God's creation. What a privilege it is to partner with you in their most formative high school years, striving to cooperate with grace so they can discover their unique path in this world.

We continue to be humbled by the many blessings our Lord bestows upon the JSerra community. We will open this fall with full enrollment and the most selective incoming class of students in school history. We see this as a clear sign that JSerra's brand of faith-first education that values the role of parents as primary educators is a winning formula.

We are excited to report on progress we have made with the following projects which will enhance our school:

- Solar panels will be mounted on the north campus buildings and the south campus parking lot.
- With the exception of the recently renovated baseball and main fields, all of the field turf on the south campus is being replaced with a completion date set for mid-August.
- Our Board of Directors allocated \$500k for campus security upgrades that will include:
 - > Additional cameras to monitor the hallways of the north campus buildings and the entirety of the back fields of the south campus
 - > New key badges for every staff member that, at the press of a button, allow them to contact school security in the event of a threat or an emergency.
 - > A permanent gate at Camino Capistrano and Oso Drive that will prohibit south campus pedestrian and vehicular traffic during the school day and after hours.
 - > FEMA-compliant emergency backpacks for every classroom.
 - > Three additional full-time security guards to allow for the continual monitoring of campus visitors during and after school hours.

We also want to take a moment to congratulate Mrs. Denise Pascoe, Mr. Zach Eckert, and Sister Miriam Holzman on being appointed to several new key leadership roles on campus. Allow us to share a little more on these roles and those who will be filling them.

Denise Pascoe, Vice Principal of Academics

Set to enter her fourth year at JSerra and 31st in education, Mrs. Pascoe's primary responsibilities will be the observation and formation of our faculty and critical ancillary academic support programs such as SERP, Magnets and On-Line Learning in order to foster a unified vision of a truly integrated Catholic education. During her more than three decades working in high schools, Mrs. Pascoe has held various roles such as math teacher, department chair, vice principal, and principal. She holds a bachelor's degree from CSULA in Business Administration as well as a master's degree from CSULB in Secondary Curriculum and Instruction. After learning of her appointment Mrs. Pascoe shared, "From the moment I stepped onto our campus, I felt at home. I am looking forward to this next step supporting JSerra while continuing my own journey to serve God."

Zach Eckert, Vice Principal of Student Formation & Leadership

Many of you already know Mr. Eckert as he has been the Director of Campus Ministry for the past nine years at JSerra. He holds a bachelor's degree from Franciscan University and recently completed his MBA from the University of Dallas. In his new role, Mr. Eckert's main emphasis will be overseeing various dimensions of campus life for students to ensure that all our opportunities to engage with them are oriented toward the cultivation of their faith, intellect, and character. He will continue to shepherd campus ministry with the help from our N.E.T. missionaries while also collaborating with the Activities Director, Athletic Director, Identity Formation team, and other groups critical to school culture on campus. From Mr. Eckert himself, "I love JSerra and the families I have been able to serve over the past nine years, and I am humbled and honored to have the opportunity to serve students in an even greater capacity with this new role in my tenth year!"

Sister Miriam Holzman, Director of Curriculum

While still teaching part-time in the science department, Sister Miriam will be leading the school's Curriculum Committee and collaborating with our department chairs and faculty. Her central responsibility will be working to develop a richer integration of Catholic principles into the broader JSerra curriculum. She'll be entering her fourth year at JSerra having taught biology and chemistry. She holds a licentiate (degree between masters and doctorate) in philosophy from the Catholic University of America as well as an advanced degree from the Institute for Catholic School Leadership at the University of St. Thomas. She also has the benefit of a breadth of perspective from teaching in four Catholic high schools across the country. Sister had this to say, "I am excited to work with our faculty and explore how we can highlight, across all subject areas, the beautiful and rich philosophical foundations central to our faith."

As a point of clarification, Mrs. Donna Vandenberg remains as one of our vice principals. We firmly believe these new roles will support our efforts to be both a high-caliber academic institution and a place of authentic, intentional, and vibrant Christian formation during the most important period of moral development for young people.

We wish you our very best as these remaining weeks of summer come to a close. And we pray for a blessed and, God-willing, an entirely "routine" 2022-23 school year.



THE NURSE'S OFFICE

We provide students and school staff with basic health care, first aid, and health counseling to promote health while emphasizing illness prevention.

The Nurse's Office is staffed with a full-time RN available during regular school hours and **located in the Administration Building.** Depending on your child's medical needs, the below information is important to provide the Nurse's Office.

MEDICATION(S)

Any prescription for Asthma Inhaler, EpiPen, ADD/ADHD medications, or antibiotics being administered during school hours or on a retreat or field trip must have a Parent/ Physician Request for Medication Form on file with the Nurse's Office for this school year.

HEALTH INFORMATION

This completed form should be brought in, faxed, or emailed to the JSerra Nurse. All medication must be in its original container with the child's name clearly marked.

California law states that students may NOT carry ANY over-the-counter (OTC) or prescription medications on them while at JSerra and/or for any JSerra-sponsored event (field trips). All medication is kept in and dispensed from the Nurse's Office and/or by a designated JSerra school personnel during JSerra-sponsored events.

DIABETES

If your student has Type 1 Diabetes, you and your student are required to come to the Nurse's Office one week prior to the beginning of school to fill out and sign a Diabetic Contract. Please refer to the Nurse page on the JSerra website for a list of diabetic supplies needed. Please present the nurse with your student's physician orders and diabetic supplies at the time of your meeting.

IMMUNIZATIONS (Required for school admission)

For all new incoming or transferring students, California State law requires that all students must be fully immunized and provide immunization paperwork before attending any school. The following vaccines are required by the state of California:

T-DAP / Polio / MMR / Hepatitis B / Varicella

We recognize that immunization may pose unique challenges for some families. If this is the case for your student, please reach out to our Nurse's Office so we can provide more personalized guidance.



ATTENDANCE

Attendance is a critical factor in the intellect and character formation of young men and women. It reflects respect for teachers, fellow students, and for the individual student's development. In addition, numerous absences may have significant negative academic impact. JSerra's rules are clearly stated in the Parent Student Handbook and should be read by students and parents.

The following reflects the basic rules regarding absences and tardies:



FULL OR PARTIAL DAY ABSENCES

All absences require school notification before 9:00am.

An email must be sent to the Attendance Office, at **attendance@jserra.org**, identifying the parent/guardian who is notifying the school, student's name, grade, and reason for absence. Otherwise, an attendance form can be found and submitted at jserra.org/parents-students/attendance.



LEAVING SCHOOL EARLY

An email must be sent before 8:00 a.m. to the Attendance Office at attendance@jserra.org.

The email must identify the parent/guardian who is notifying the school, the student's name, grade, time of departure, and reason for early departure.

- The student must report to the Attendance Office before school.
- The student will be issued an Off-Campus Permit. The student will show the permit to the appropriate teacher for release from class.
- The student will then report to the Attendance Office to be signed out by a parent/guardian.
- The student who drives himself/herself must sign out at the Attendance Office before leaving school.



LEAVING SCHOOL DUE TO ILLNESS

The student must report to the Nurse's Office when ill.

- The nurse will determine the severity of the illness and will notify the parent/guardian.
- The parent/guardian must report to the Attendance Office to sign the student out and then report to the nurse for dismissal.
- The student who drives himself/herself must sign out at the Attendance Office before leaving school.



TARDIES

- Students who arrive <u>LESS THAN 10 MINUTES LATE</u> for school should report to their assigned class.
- Students who arrive <u>MORE THAN 10 MINUTES LATE</u> for class should report to the Attendance Office.



ALL-SCHOOL MASS

Wednesday all-school Mass is our school's central spiritual event for the building of JSerra's culture of faith. Parents are invited to attend! We ask students not to schedule appointments on Wednesdays during Mass.



CAMPUS MINISTRY

RETREATS

Retreats make space for personal encounters with Christ and the community, engaging students of all faiths and backgrounds. Hosted at an off-campus site, retreats include time for recreation via swimming pools, water slides, challenge courses, and game rooms while taking advantage of natural surroundings conducive to personal reflection and an encounter with Christ through prayer, Mass, Confession, and praise and worship. Retreats are considered excused absences. Students who miss a day of classes for a retreat will receive one extra school day to make up schoolwork that has been missed.

TUESDAY NIGHT LIGHTS (TNL)

Tuesday Night Lights (TNL) helps each and every student grow personally and spiritually. It is a weekly gathering for students who wish to meet and make friends, learn more or grow in their faith through inspiring messages, worship, service, and leadership. The nights vary from beach bonfires, dodgeball tournaments, movie nights, dinners at Chick-fil-A and Ruby's, and include games, music, a short talk from one of our Campus Ministers, and an opportunity to connect with peers. Students do not need to register and are invited to attend on Tuesdays from 7:00-8:30 p.m. Please see the Lion Lowdown and Calendar for up-to-date times and special locations.

NET

NET stands for National Evangelization Teams, and this year, JSerra will again have a NET Team of our own! In September 2022, eight young adult missionaries will be on our campus through May 2023 serving students through Campus Ministry. They will be chaperoning our retreats, TNL Nights, and engaging with and mentoring students during the school day in classes, at breaks, and afterschool in athletics and extra-curricular activities. These missionaries are mature in their faith as they lead teenagers, yet young enough to know clearly what it's like to be a teenager in today's world.

BE A HOST!

JSerra is seeking host families for the NET missionaries for a **two-week minimum** stay for two people (either two men or two women). Families may host more than two people and/or for a longer stay than two weeks if they wish.



CHRISTIAN SERVICE

Christian Service is a requirement for graduation. A minimum of 80 hours must be completed over a student's four-year career. All hours must be approved by the Coordinator of Christian Service.

THE DEADLINES FOR COMPLETING THIS REQUIREMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

• 80 hours must be approved by April 30th of the students' senior year.

CAMPUS MINISTRY

• Students may choose when they earn their 80 service hours. There is not a yearly requirement. However, service records will be reviewed when students are considered for leadership opportunities such as NHS, the Peru mission trip, and Caritas Christi. It is therefore recommended that students earn 20 hours per school year to be considered current.



- When students complete a service project, the hours must be submitted for verification within a limited timeframe. If service hours are not submitted before the verification deadline, the credit will expire.
 - > Each January 15th, hours from the previous summer or semester must be entered into x2VOL. Hours from the previous summer or semester entered after January 15th will not be approved.
 - Second semester hours must be entered no later than April 30th. Hours entered after April 30th from the second semester will not be approved.
- There is no limit to the number of Christian Service hours students may complete in a school year.

SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

Our aim is to assist JSerra students in identifying charities for which students can perform Christian service and practice the type of love that we are made for. Service opportunities will be shared in the weekly Lion Lowdown newsletter that is emailed to all parents and students. Students are welcome to find other opportunities as long as they align with the Christian Service goals.



The purpose of JSerra Athletics is to form relationships built upon integrity and love, with intentional focus on personal and competitive development of student-athletes and service to others.

SPORTS & SEASONS

JSerra offers 27 sports (25 of which compete in CIF) that take place during the school year. Each sport is open for registration prior to the start of the season.

- FALL SEASON (Aug-Nov): Boys & Girls Cross Country, Football, Girls Volleyball, Boys Water Polo, Girls Tennis, Girls Golf

- SPRING SEASON (Feb-May): Baseball, Boys Golf, Boys Lacrosse, Girls Lacrosse, Softball, Boys & Girls Swimming & Diving, Boys Tennis, Boys & Girls Track & Field, Boys Volleyball, Girls Beach Volleyball
