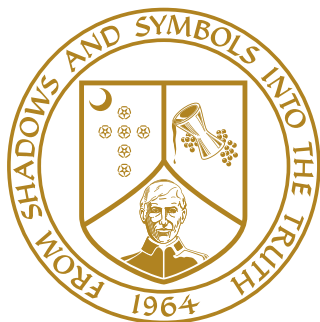

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Alumni, Parents, and Families of Cardinal Newman High School,



As we conclude the 2021-2022 academic year, I want to recognize the determination and resilience demonstrated by our students and families, as well as the incredible Cardinal Newman faculty and staff who persevered these many months of changes, demands, and challenges that were cast upon us as a result

of the terrible COVID-19 pandemic. I am grateful for our community's trust that Cardinal Newman High School always finds a way to get the most out of every situation for our students – always putting their education, their wellness, and their high school experiences first. It's been a difficult year – but it has also been a blessed year with the greatest blessing being the growth, formation, and success of our students. God continues to bless us and we thank Him for protecting our school community.

On June 5, we celebrated the graduation of the Class of 2021. Cardinal Newman's Class of '21 has been challenged in ways we could not imagine: the Tubbs fire in October of their Freshman year which destroyed a large portion of our school and many of our student, faculty and staff's homes; Their adapting to ever-changing environments - classes held at Resurrection Parish, in temporary classrooms on our campus, and in distance learning for 12 months due to County safety mandates; And among it all, the many shifting schedules due to PG&E power outages, smoke days, and wildfire evacuations. "When we look back on our journey at Cardinal Newman High School, we each have cherished memories and relationships, but what sets our class apart is the adversity we have faced... Hidden in the uncertainty and loss are important lessons for the Class of 2021. James 1:2-3 says, 'Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness.' I believe our experiences with the fires helped us become more resilient and dedicated. We have

had to ask tough questions and wrestle with our faith. I believe the Class of 2021, with help from our families and the Cardinal Newman community, has grown tremendously from the trials we have experienced. We have a better understanding of the futility of putting our hope in material things that can easily be taken away. We have learned the value of service, gratitude, and adaptable learning. Our bond as a community has grown strong."

As we say farewell to the 2021-2022 school year, we are pleased to welcome Mr. Nicholas Reynolds as Cardinal Newman High School's new Principal, effective July 1. Mr. Reynolds graduated from Sacred Heart Cathedral Preparatory in San Francisco in 1997, earned his degree and credential in History from Sonoma State University, and served at St. Vincent de Paul High School in Petaluma since 2003. Mr. Reynolds has served St. Vincent's in the roles of Teacher, Department Chair, Track and Field Head Coach, and Dean of Faculty and Academics. Among the highlights of his tenure, Mr. Reynolds has organized and led the school's Curriculum Committee, implemented a new teacher evaluation protocol, redesigned the school's student leadership program, served as a club moderator for many student organizations, and led the school's WCEA accreditation process. Mr. Reynolds is inspired and dedicated to the mission of Catholic education and is well-liked and respected by students, families and co-workers. He is known as a hard worker who truly cares about students and teachers.

Please join us in moving ahead with resilience, strength, and joy. The close of this school year has marked an unprecedented time in our school's history. Not only has Cardinal Newman High School endured the effects of fire, smoke and power outages over the past 4 years, this year's pandemic has tried our patience, and tested our resolve.

We have officially closed the first phases of A Call to Lead Capital Campaign to raise the \$38,000,000 for our new Two-Story Classroom Building and our new Student Life Center & Library. Both projects are fully-funded with gifts and pledges from our generous community! THANK YOU

to our donors that have so generously made gifts and pledges to our rebuilding efforts. What a tremendous accomplishment our school community has achieved! Because of this generosity, no tuition dollars were used to fund these construction projects! We could not have done it without YOU!

We are also pleased with the pace which our design and construction projects have kept throughout these unprecedented times. We are thankful for our dedicated partners on these projects - Quattrocchi Kwok Architects, Wright Contracting and GMH Builders who continue to support our community.

DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS UPDATE

TWO-STORY CLASSROOM BUILDING



Our Two-Story Classroom Building is now in its 13th month of construction under the watchful eye of our contractors and architects. The estimated occupancy date for this new facility is the Fall of 2021. Once occupancy is received, we will be removing the temporary portable classrooms that were brought in following the fire. We are grateful for the wonderful partnership with the Wright family and their construction team which will deliver a beautiful classroom facility on our campus. The new facility will house 18 classrooms, 3 resource rooms, 3 staff rooms, a large outdoor stage, an arts building and kiln, and Cardinal Newman's first elevator! STUDENT LIFE CENTER & LIBRARY

Our new Student Life Center & Library project has made wonderful progress as we outline its use and function for our students. Much effort and thought has gone into the design of each area within this new facility. It will house a student lounge, cafe, indoor and outdoor dining, offices for all the different student activities including Christian Service, Campus Ministry, Student Leadership, and the Chaplain's office. It will also include the T. Bucher Family Innovation Center, broadcasting & recording studios, digital lab, library, staff lounge, learning lounge and work spaces for large and small student groups.

This project has been fully funded with your generous gifts and pledges to A Call to Lead campaign! With the funding efforts complete, we are able to focus on the final design elements, and the construction timeline for this new facility. Bids have been reviewed, and GMH Builders have been selected as the construction

company for this project. Construction documents will be completed and site work has begun! We anticipate our building permit to be received in time to begin construction January of 2022, with an estimated completion date in the Spring of 2023.

CLASS OF 2021 CN GRADUATE LUKE LAMPERTI SPRINTS TO

LUKE LAMPERTI, 18, OF TRINITY RACING SURVIVED LATE CRASHES TO WIN THE 2021 U.S. NATIONAL CRITERIUM TITLE.

Class of 2021 Cardinal Newman graduate, Luke Lamperti (Trinity Racing), powered to the U.S. criterium national title after a crash-marred final lap in downtown Knoxville, Tennessee.

Lamperti, a member of the U.S. junior and Under-23 national team, survived a crash coming out of the final corner to take the biggest result of his budding career. So chaotic was the final lap that announcers required several minutes to identify Lamperti as the winner.

"I definitely wanted [to win] and I knew I was capable of it," Lamperti said at the finish. "A lot can go on in a crit — it's not always who's the best, a lot can happen."

Adding to Lamperti's surprise victory are his age — he's only 18 — and the fact that he competed without any teammates.

Indeed, Lamperti flew under the radar in the elite men's criterium, as most of the attention was focused on the powerhouse criterium teams L39ion of Los Angeles, as well as U.S. domestic pro teams Elevate-Webiplex, Aevo Cycling, and Wildlife Generation.

With its dominating victories at last weekend's Tulsa Tough, L39ion of Los Angeles spent much of the race patrolling the front, with additional horsepower added by the Best Buddies squad of reigning U.S. criterium champion Travis McCabe.

The course traced a winding lap through downtown Knoxville, and on each lap, the peloton tackled hills, tight corners, descents.

Lamperti said he had his eyes on L39ion of Los Angeles, to see how the race was going to play out. Without teammates he was at a sizable disadvantage in the race.

"Everyone knew L39ion was going to do a good lead-out like always, and everyone wanted to try something different," Lamperti said. "Everyone saw how they raced at Tulsa and knew if you followed you weren't going to come around."

Coming into the final lap L39ion patrolled the front of the race, with surges by Wildlife Generation and Aevo upping the pace. Then, with three corners remaining, the Elevate-Webiplex duo of Sam Bassetti and Eric Young sprung from the field, just as riders hit the barriers and caused a crash.

The pileup took down McCabe, as well as riders from Project Echelon, Team Clif Bar, and other squads. Up ahead, Lamperti surfed the wheels of Young and Bassetti and then unleashed his sprint for the win.

"Everyone was fighting for that and it was quite hectic," Lamperti said. "There was a crash and I was able to navigate back up to Sam Bassetti's wheel — who's also a hometown guy — I was able to get to his wheel and jump on the last corner."

"I went on the left side and everyone went wide, and I think people caught the barriers wide and I was able to get around it," Lamperti added.

VICTORY AT 2021 U.S. NATIONAL CRITERIUM CHAMPIONSHIPS!

Lamperti hails from Sebastopol, California, and was a product of the Swift Racing program run by Laura Charameda. He and his older brother — 2019 junior national road champion Gianni Lamperti — grew up racing together and eventually joined the Lux-Sideshow development squad of Roy Knickman.

Lamperti blossomed on the Lux squad, and spent multiple years racing overseas with the U.S. national squad in Belgium and The Netherlands. In 2019 he was second on a stage of the Tour du Pays de Vaud, a Nation's Cup junior race in Switzerland. He also

claimed the mountains classification at Canada's Tour de l'Abitibi, finishing second on two separate stages.

He recently took his first victory in Europe — a stage of the Tour d'Eure-et-Loir, a stage race in France.

Lamperti said he heads back to Europe in a few weeks to continue his European campaign.

"Just actually came back here from Italy — back here, then home for a few weeks to California, and then back over," he said.

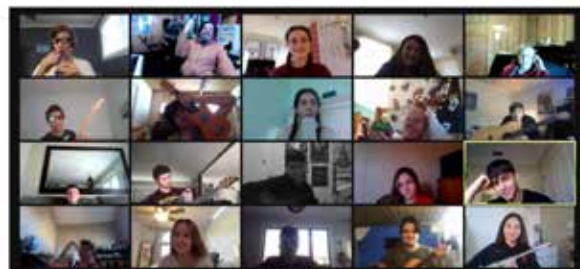
Question: You are a Junior now and you have been in the school band (Modern Band) since you were a freshman. Describe what you were doing with music before you got to Cardinal Newman.

Question: If you could work, record, perform and collaborate with any musician in the world who would it be and why?

Question: Since you have been in the school band for several years you have been involved in choosing, rehearsing, recording and performing lots of different songs. What were some of the most interesting or memorable songs you worked on with the band and why?

Sophia: There have been so many fun ones, however the one that comes to mind is "Baby I'm Yours" by Breakbot, specifically because we all hated it so much that we ended up loving it and it ended up bringing the band closer together freshman year.

Question: The 2020/21 school year was certainly a different one for you and everyone else. The fact that the school band could not meet in person to collaborate and rehearse meant that the class really changed focus. What were some of the things you learned to do or learned to do better, music-wise, during the online Zoom school year?

Sophia: Music production has been the one thing I've learned the most about this year. Mr. A showed us how to use DAWs like Garageband and Logic, as well as how to mix audio to make the music sound professional. It's been so fun, and I now have an additional appreciation for music and the production that goes into each piece.



Question: When I think of you as a music director, I'm always impressed with your mature approach to being in a band and collaborating with lots of other people. Sometimes you get to do songs that you know and love. Other times you wind up working on music that might not be your personal favorite but you do it anyway, with lots of professional enthusiasm; you understand it's good for the group. But imagine for a moment, the group included all the best musicians in the world that could play anything, any style of music. What are some things you would want to do with a group like that?

Sophia: This past year I've really gotten into jazz and electronic music. It would be really cool to incorporate those two genres in a song, especially because it's not something we generally get to do. I think part of being a musician is going out of your comfort zone to create something awesome, so bringing those two genres together in a piece of music would be really fun to play.

Question: In years past I've gotten to see how you have developed at rehearsing and performing with a live band. During our distance learning school year, I've enjoyed the music videos you have made. You have become quite accomplished over the school year at recording yourself at home, playing all the instruments, singing all the parts, and creating interesting music videos. What gear, instruments and other kinds of equipment do you use to record and create your videos?

Sophia: After we first started using Garageband to put the music together, I knew that this was something I could really learn and improve on. I took the opportunity to purchase an interface, a microphone, as well as Logic (a musical software). I realized that they were essential in achieving a good quality sound. As far as filming, I just use my phone or my computer to film and edit.

Question: I have a strong feeling that music, composing, recording and performing will continue to be a part of your life after high school. I have to admit, one of my main goals as a music director/teacher is to help cultivate the skills that students need to continue with music well after high school. What are your ideas, plans, goals and dreams for your music after Cardinal Newman?

Sophia: My dream job has always been to be a Speech Pathologist. One of the ways I can do that job to help people learn is music. CAN'T WAIT 'TIL NEXT YEAR

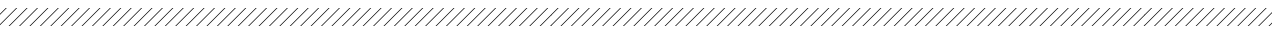

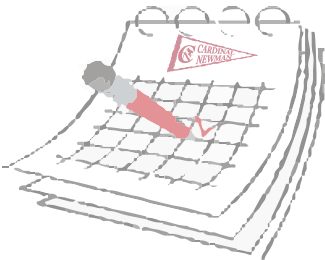
