

In the great opera, *Porgy and Bess*, there is the beautiful song *Summertime*. The song begins with the words, *Summertime and the living is easy*. Does that describe your summer or is it more accurate to say, "Summertime and the living is busy?"

Without a conscious effort, we cannot keep the busyness out of autumn time, wintertime, springtime, or summertime. However, we need time to rest, renew and repair. Even Jesus knew that he needed to step back from the hustle and bustle. The gospels record many occasions when Jesus spent time alone with his Heavenly Father in long periods of prayer. 

In the Gospels, Jesus is often seen taking off to "a deserted place" to pray, and he did it especially when he seemed to be the busiest (Lk 5:16), or troubled by something, like the execution of his friend and cousin John the Baptist (Mt 14:13). Sometimes he would get up early

to find the time (Mk 1:35), or sneak off at the end of the day (Mt 14:23), but it is clear this time in solitude was important to him. Moreover, it was something Jesus knew was important for his apostles as well. In last Sunday's Gospel, when the apostles returned to Jesus after being busy with preaching and ministering, he said to them: "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while" (Mk 6:31). Jesus knew that time in solitude to commune with God was absolutely essential.

This theme of going away to a deserted place runs throughout the Old Testament as well. The Greek word for "deserted place" is eremos, which is also sometimes translated 'desert' or 'wilderness', and is used in the Septuagint for the desert through which the Israelites wandered for 40 years. Once the chosen people had settled in the promised land, the Lord was often troubled by how they began to fall away from him. After lamenting their unfaithfulness in the book of Hosea, the Lord expresses his desire to draw Israel back to himself saying "I will lead her into the desert [eremos] and speak to her heart. . . She shall respond there as in the days of her youth, when she came up from the land of Egypt" (Hos 2:14-15). The Lord remembered the time in the desert as one of special closeness to himself, and longed for the Israelites to come back to a time of being 'in the desert' with him.

This theme of going to a deserted place/desert/ wilderness was on my mind a lot this past week as I took a trip to Isle Royale. It was for me a beautiful time to 'come away,' as Jesus invited his apostles to do, 'to a deserted place and rest a while.' There was great peace in the stillness, and I was very aware of the Lord's presence, especially as I celebrated Mass out there. I came back feeling deeply refreshed. In the midst of our busy lives, Jesus' example and instruction to his disciples remind us that, especially when we are busy, we need to find time to be in solitude with the Lord. It might mean rising early or sneaking away at the end of the day, but time spent in quiet with God is essential to our spiritual and even emotional well-being. I was so edified this past Tuesday with the return of Adoration throughout the day. Those hours we spend in the

church before Jesus are a uniquely precious time to come away to a 'deserted place' and enter into solitude with the Lord.






The Church of the Divine Child offers the faith formation opportunities for our youth parishioners in grades 1-8 whom do not attend Divine Child Elementary School.




COMING TOGETHER FOR THE GREATER GOOD

July is National Cord Blood Awareness Month

Give life twice, give cord blood! Cord blood is found in a baby's umbilical cord and is a rich source of ethical stem cells. A transplant of stem cells from cord blood can help someone with a life-threatening disease. There are more than 80 diseases cord blood can help treat including: leukemia, anemia, and lymphoma. Your baby has the power to save someone that has a serious illness – including you if necessary.

Following birth, a child's umbilical cord and placenta will be thrown away as medical waste by the hospital. Instead, the cord blood can be privately banked or donated for use in medical treatments.

Cord blood donation is EASY, FREE, and PAINLESS! It doesn't

affect the birthing process. If you decide to bank or donate your baby's cord blood, arrangements must be made before you deliver the baby. You must pre-register during your pregnancy.

Saint Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor is one of three participating hospitals in Michigan that has partnered with Karmanos Cancer Institute's *J.P. McCarthy Cord Stem Cell Bank* to collect umbilical cord blood. It is a public, non-profit stem cell bank with over 1,200 umbilical cord blood units in its inventory. Grand Rapids also has a Cord Blood Bank partnering with hospitals in Kalamazoo, Saginaw, Holland, and Grand Rapids.

Grandparents have special roles in loving and spoiling their grandchildren, but they can also bring key values to a family's legacy of faith.

"Very often it is grandparents who ensure that the most important values are passed down to their grandchildren, and 'many people can testify that they owe their initiation into the Christian life to their grandparents.' Their words, their affection or simply their presence help children to realize that history did not begin with them, that they are now part of an age-old pilgrimage..." (*Amoris Laetitia* 192)

Christmas, 2011. There was one more gift under the Christmas tree. My husband and I opened it to find a very small Michigan onesie. My daughter and son-in-law Betsy and Jeff announced that they were expecting their first baby; thus began our journey into grandparenting. Today, we have four beautiful grandchildren whom we cherish. As we assumed this new role in our lives it caused us to ask: What is our role as grandparents? How can we pass on the richness of our Catholic faith to our grandchildren?

I can remember hearing "You get to spoil them, fill them with sugar, and send them home." While there is a fragment of truth to those words, the real truth is that we are given the grace to love these little ones in a way that extends the love we poured out to our own children. We get to preserve the lineage of history and faith from prior generations to all future generations. If we stop to think about it, we are the links that maintain the strength of our families' legacy of faith

The challenges of adult children not practicing the faith, the coronavirus and the pressures of today's secular culture can seem daunting and leave us feeling incapable of making a difference in the lives of our grandchildren. However, we are not dependent solely on ourselves. We are empowered by the Lord's many spiritual gifts for the important work of shepherding our grandchildren in their faith lives.

The Power of Prayer: A wise friend told me many years ago that she prayed daily for her children, their vocations and their future spouses should they marry. Since then, I have dedicated the third decade of my rosary for these intentions. Pray with and for your grandchildren—show them how to make the Sign of the Cross, pray before meals and bedtime and bless each of them, praying for their individual intentions. Ask them to pray for you. Even if you're far away, use the time you "see" them on video to do this

The Power of Presence: Despite the pace of today's digital culture, there is nothing more important than simply "being there" for your grandchildren. Sit with them, listen to them, be slow to judge. Point out the beauty of creation, how you see God working in their lives and how special they are to you. Show a genuine interest in their lives and interests.

The Power of Perseverance: Stay the course. Even when you don't experience immediate results. I have talked with many people entering the RCIA process or returning to the Church who mention how their grandma or grandpa were instrumental in helping them to meet Jesus and the saints by remaining steadfast models of the faith.

The Power of Simplicity: My husband and I had the opportunity to travel to the Holy Land in 2000. Among the holy sites we visited, the Church of Ste. Anne stands out as perhaps the simplest. It marks the traditional site of the home of Jesus' maternal grandparents, St. Anne and St. Joachim, and the birthplace of the Virgin Mary. Its tranquility stands in high contrast to the surrounding business district. It gave us cause to reflect on the life of Mary, and how her parents taught her to live and pray. What a joy it must have been, even if unwittingly, for these holy grandparents to share the sacred stories of the prophets and the prayers with Jesus!

Keep it simple and share the stories and prayers of your own faith journey with your grandchildren. Tell them about your first Communion, how you learned to pray and your favorite Bible stories. Let them ask you questions. As Pope St. Paul VI said, "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." (Evangelii Nuntiandi 41)



Please call the Rectory Office to request this Sacrament. In emergency situations when the office is closed, the emergency line attendant will take the call.

Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a **Baptism class** prior to the Baptism.


