Taking pride in the personalising of pathways and focusing on the individual student's interests, strengths and needs, TSS provides a "boutique" educational experience catering for a total enrolment of 120 students. An alternative to mainstream schooling structures and systems is offered through TSS's "studio model" that sees students working under the guidance of mentors to combine their studies with real-world projects and engagements to achieve their WACE and, if desired, an ATAR.

TSS shares its vision - *Making a positive difference in our world* - with All Saints' College and offers the opportunity for students to make a positive difference in the world through tapping into and celebrating students' difference, diversity, skills and interests. This model enables every student to flourish through their contribution to, and engagement with, the "real world" via meaningful projects.

TSS's studio model of learning helps provide for our young people a seamless transition into the world of tertiary learning and work: connected to the real world - authentic and purposeful.

Central to this role is firstly the mentoring and pastoral care of a group of diverse individuals enrolled at TSS, involving co-designing, developing and monitoring Individual Learning Programs that meet the specific needs of the students and their pastoral and wellbeing needs in collaboration with the Director of TSS and key ASC staff.

Secondly, the facilitating teachers will plan and deliver specific programs in areas of specialty including, initially, Mathematics, Science and/or Design and Technologies and subsequently those teachers who can support student learning in a range of areas including, but not limited to: VET, English, Design, Careers, STEM, Performing Arts.

Thirdly, the TSS teaching-facilitating staff will be familiar with the delivery of programs that use project-based learning and design thinking methodologies, co-design processes and connection to real world outcomes. This work will include connecting with mentors from business, social enterprise, community and industry, co-developing project briefs with those mentors in collaboration with students, and monitoring the progress to support positive outcomes and experiences.
