Dear Parents/Carers,

I would like to open this week's news update with a big 'thank you' to the whole academy community in continuing to maintain the Covid-19

safety measures in place at the academy, until the end of this academic year. I am sure that by us all continuing to respect each other's personal space, as the lifting of national

restrictions takes affect from Monday 19th July 2021, we can continue to try and reduce the chance of unnecessary isolation before the summer holidays. The academy remains committed to ensuring the safety of all children, staff and parents/ carers at this time.

Currently, the rates of Covid-19 infections is rising and as a result, 'Transition Day' has been rescheduled to a 'Transition morning'. The headlines are:

- 'Transition morning' will continue on Wednesday 21st July 2021.
- This is to ensure all children in current Reception and Year 1 spend time with their new teachers and support staff (staffing list will be sent out on Tuesday 20th July.)


