SHS Civil Rights Club Receives SEF Grant


The Civil Rights Club is honored to announce that it has been awarded an SEF grant for the 2020-2021 school year. This grant enables the Civil Rights Club to author an event at the K-2 schools which will include every student receiving their own copy of the book, *Magnificent Homespun Brown*.

Magnificent Homespun Brown is written by a former Portland Public Schools kindergarten teacher, Ms. Samara Cole Doyon. Ms. Doyon grew up in Central Maine and is the biracial daughter of a white Mainer and Black Haitian father. This book focuses on the beauty of the color brown, specifically in relation to a young child's skin. It is illustrated by world-renowned artist, Kaylani Juanita and celebrates the magnificence that is the color brown. This book changes the narrative so that Black and Brown children can celebrate their inherent value. *Magnificent Homespun Brown* has recently been named one of the Best Books of 2020 by the New York Public Library system.



Important Message to Seniors from the Senior Placement Office

Hello Class of 2021,

The Placement Office will start sending your **Mid-Year Transcript** out to your colleges beginning Tuesday, February 2nd, when the grades are finalized and stored in PowerSchool. If any senior has an incomplete, please let our office know, so we can hold off sending the transcript until February 5th, when all work must be finalized.

Students will likely begin to receive notifications from colleges that mid-year reports are due, sometimes "urgently." These notifications are auto-generated; colleges are aware that most high schools have mid-terms in January and will be forwarding transcripts as soon as they are available. If a student receives a concrete request specific to his/her application indicating that a mid-year report **MUST** be received by a specific date, please let our office know.

Please note, that it will take me 3 or 4 days to upload all the transcripts to each senior's individual Naviance Account and send them out to all their colleges.

This Month In STEM

Intro to Engineering students will be working with Leesa Joiner and Kerry Kertes to design and create cell phone holders. Students will use "Illustrator App" to design their holder then use the school laser printer to create their own cell phone holders. After the design process is completed, Jon McHugh will direct the students in marketing ideas and cost analysis.

Environmental and Civil Engineering Students will be competing in the Tower Design Challenge underwritten by Fluor: A Global engineering and Construction Company. Students must build the highest tower possible then hold a defined mass for a predetermined period of time. If successful, the students final written report will be submitted to Fluor for evaluation and awards. If a student design is accepted, a grant will be given to SHS in their name.





April 5-9: Academic Counseling: HS teachers and students. Talk to each class about general recommendations for the next year (ex. English 9-3 would likely be recommended for English 10-3) and then meet with individual students that would have an individual recommendation (ex. Up a level or down a level). The hope is that this will be more efficient use of class time.

April 19-23: School vacation

April 26-30: HS Counselors assist students with online course registration process

April 30: HS Online course Registration Closed

May 3: Print student requests and course /selection needs

May 3: Complete course request data for each content area

May 5-7: Teacher review and flag concerns

May 10-14: Counselors work with flagged students on schedule changes

May 10: Course registration data to HS Dept. Heads

May 10-14: Principal meets with Dept. Heads to review course/section numbers

May 17-21: Begin creation of Master Schedule

May 28: Master Schedule completed

June 1-4: Distribute student schedules for Fall 2021 without teacher names
