CODE OF CONDUCT

LASP provides a disciplined, stimulating learning climate. Consistent with the instructional day, We use Positive Behavioral and Intervention Supports (PBIS) and promotes Lincoln's four expectations (kind, responsible, respectful, and safe) for positive school-wide behavior.

PROGRAM ACCESS

LASP operates at Lincoln School immediately following each instructional day.

LASP students report to their ASP teacher immediately following the instructional day. All students need to be signed out by a parent or an ASP teacher. Occasional field trips and community service activities take place off-site. For occasions such as these, roundtrip transportation for field trips is provided. Students are escorted by LASP staff or school buses are utilized for community service and mentoring activities during program hours. Parent permission is required for all off-site activities.
