# What's Changing for Summer

As regulations and executive orders expire with changes in the pandemic, we will return to our primary focus on education, integrating COVID-19 response into our existing pre-pandemic public health support.

**<u>GOAL</u>**: Support and work with families to help mitigate spread.

- Increased self/family responsibility and choice
- Masks are optional in most settings, but are still recommended by MDH/CDC
- Contact tracing, isolation/quarantine is the responsibility of individuals





## **Requirements for Summer**



- Continue to use the RedCap Survey to report positive cases to MDH
- Staff and students need to self-report to administration if they are COVID-19 positive, and/or self-isolating or self-quarantining
- Isolate when sick (all vaccinated and unvaccinated persons)
- Quarantine if unvaccinated and a household member is COVID-19 positive
- A general notification letter of positive case will be sent to learning community
- Cleaning protocols
- Supply PPE disposable masks, sanitizer etc.
- HEPA filters in instructional areas
- Masks in certain situations only

# Masks and Face Coverings



#### REQUIRED

Masks must be worn on transportation vehicles to and from instructional activities (*CDC requirement*)

Masks must be worn in Driver Education Vehicles (CDC requirement)

Masks must be worn in child care settings (SACC) when indoors through June 30 <u>or</u> until the state reaches a 70% vaccination rate (whichever comes first)

#### **RECOMMENDED**

Masks are optional on transportation vehicles for co-curricular activities

Masks are optional in all instructional and classroom settings

Masks are optional in child care settings (SACC) when indoors after June 30 <u>or</u> after 70% state vaccination rate (whichever comes first)

Masks are optional in outdoor child care settings

Mask breaks as needed

# Social Distancing

No social distancing requirements, however staff is encouraged to rethink instructional strategies and activities when possible.

<u>GOAL</u>: Create as safe of an environment as possible, without impeding academic progress.

- More distance between staff, students and all involved in summer programming is safer
- Grouping students is safer
- Being outside is safer
- Instrumental and music activities with distance is safer
