NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the purchase of science supplies and materials as required from the awarded contractors in accordance with the requirements of General Municipal Law, section 103 through June 30, 2022.

16. SALE OF VEHICLE

WHEREAS a vehicle in the district's maintenance fleet, specifically the 2007 Jacobson HR5111 Mower, VIN 6911607646 has been deemed obsolete and unnecessary; and...

WHEREAS said vehicle has been let for sale via a publicly advertised on-line public auction conducted by Auctions International beginning July 13, 2021 and concluding on July 27, 2021.

NOW THEREFORE...

BE IT RESOLVED that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education authorizes the sale of the 2007 Jacobson HR5111 Mower, VIN 6911607646 to the highest recorded bidder, John Prickett, at the cost of \$11,000. The vehicle will be removed from District inventory.

17. <u>DISPOSAL OF SUPPLIES</u>

BE IT RESOLVED that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education authorizes the disposal of attached books and supplies located at the library, Louis M. Klein Middle School.

18. <u>DISPOSAL OF EQUIPMENT:</u>

BE IT RESOLVED that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education authorizes the disposal of three Blodgett pizza ovens located at the Harrison High School.

19. 2020/21 RETIREMENT CONTRIBUTION RESERVE SUB-FUND

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Harrison Central School District has previously established a sub-fund within the Reserve for Retirement Contributions in accordance with General Municipal Law Section 6-r in anticipation of future payments for mandated employer contributions due to the NYS Teachers' Retirement System (TRS), known as the TRS sub-fund; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education previously approved a resolution appropriating a maximum sum for the TRS sub- fund;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby amend the resolution approved by the Board at the Board meeting of June 16, 2021, and authorize that, as of June 30, 2021, in anticipation of future mandated employer retirement contributions (and in recognition of the necessity to sustain the above appropriations to help offset the tax levy in future years) the TRS sub-fund within the Reserve for Retirement Contributions, including interest accumulated, be funded at a level not to exceed two per centum of the total compensation or salaries of all teachers in the employ of said school district who are members of TRS paid during the immediately preceding fiscal year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board appropriate the sum of \$1,081,241 from 2020-2021 unappropriated unassigned fund balance in the general fund and authorize the Assistant Superintendent for Business to transfer such amount from unappropriated unassigned balance for the 2020-2021 school year to the TRS sub-fund within the Reserve for Retirement Contributions.
