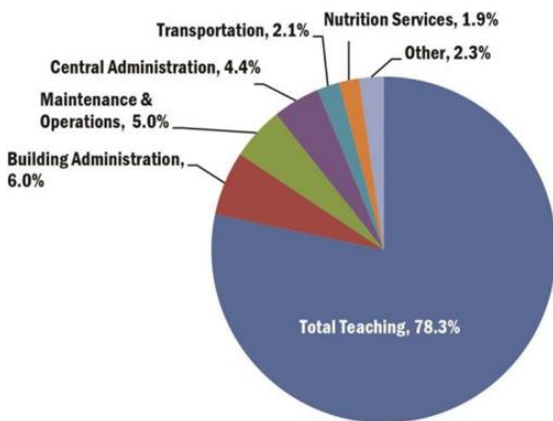

## School Description

The staff at Christa McAuliffe work in teams to best meet the needs of students. All decisions are measured by the academic and social benefit to our students. Our Reach for the Stars program is designed to help all students be their best by showing kindness and respect and by being safe and responsible at school. Parent involvement is a key component to the success of our students. We use a variety of communication strategies to keep parents informed of student progress. We have an active PTSA that supports many after school programs and provides resources for teachers.

## 2019-20 School Goals

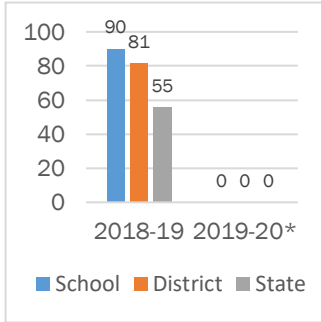
Teachers examined state assessment results to determine school goals. Teachers met to discuss strategies to be used to increase performance. Grade level teams then met to refine strategies, design interventions and create challenge opportunities for students.

- K-2 Reading: 90% of students at standard on the End of Year DIBELS assessment
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 88% of students at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 88% of students at standard
- Grade 5 Science: 87% of students at standard
- Achievement Gap: 43.7% of students listed on the equity grid provided in August 2018 will improve by one or more proficiency levels in either ELA or math as measured by May 2019 state assessment data.
- School Effectiveness: Increase the percentage of students who "agree mostly/completely" with the statement "Students respect those who are different from them" from 98% to 100%,
- Attendance: Improvement from 4.7% of students having a 10% or greater absence rate to 3.5% of students having a 10% or greater absence rate as measured by June 2019 attendance information
- Discipline: Improvement from 113 communication slips being handed out to students during the school year to 110.

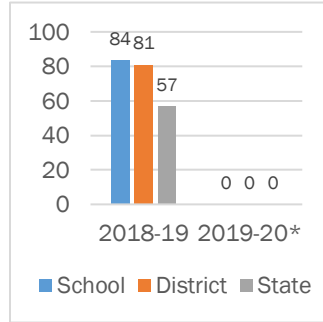

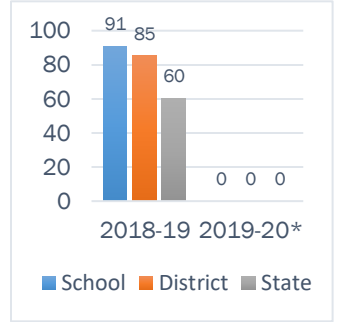
3rd Grade English Language Arts



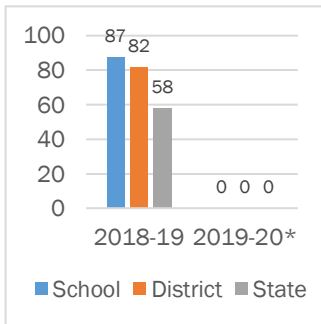
4th Grade English Language Arts



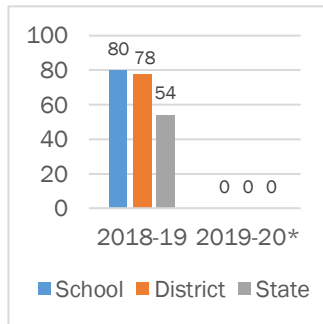
5th Grade English Language Arts



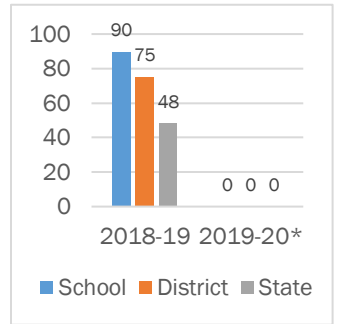
3rd Grade Math



4th Grade Math

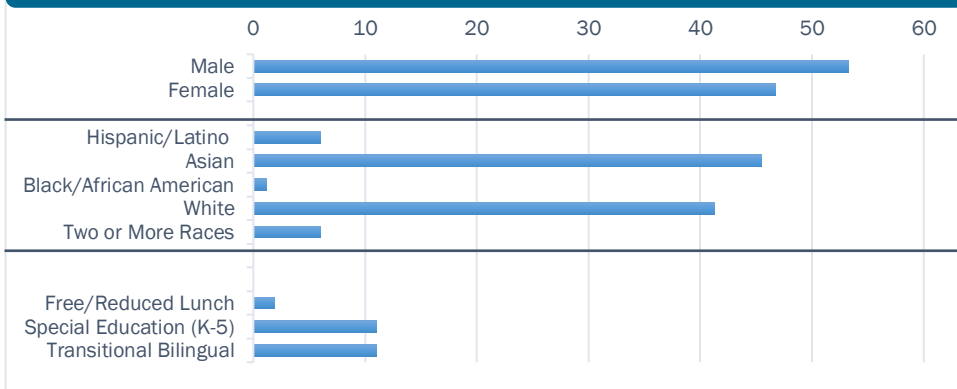


5th Grade Math
