School Description

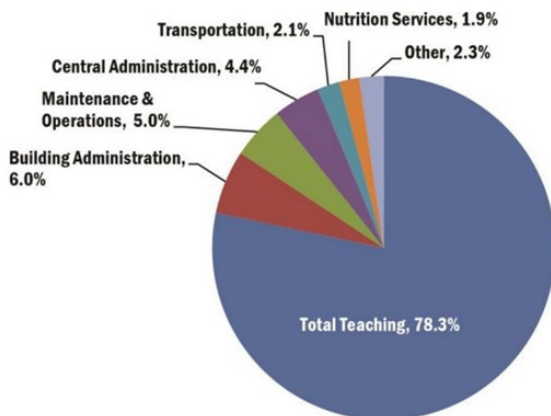

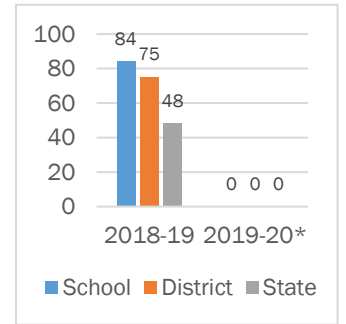
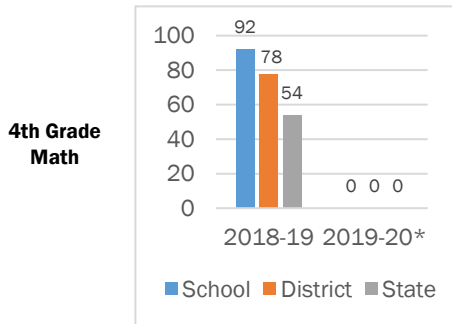
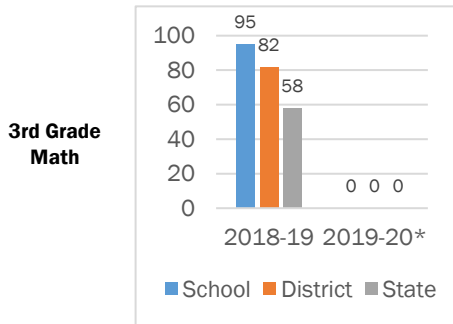
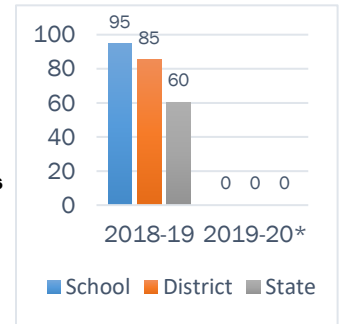
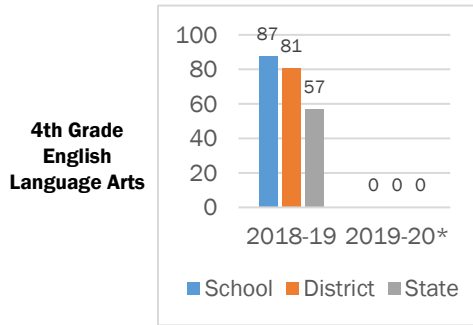
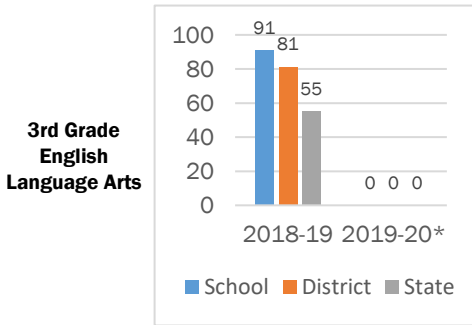
2019-20 School Goals

Staff developed academic goals based on past performance on assessment scores.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 89% of K-2 students at standard on DIBELS end of year assessment.
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 85% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 92% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 93% at standard
- Achievement gap: 50% of Safety Net students will be at standard in reading according to the EOY DIBELS
- School Effectiveness: Staff working across grade levels to increase student learning will improve from 87.81% agreeing mostly or completely to 90% agreeing mostly or completely
- Attendance: Our goal this year is to reduce overall daily tardiness by 25% by the end of the 2018-2019 school year.
- Discipline: By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, third, fourth, and fifth grade students at Smith will report that they know how to be respectful to peers and that they frequently feel respected by their peers 25 percent more than they reported on the beginning of the year SEL student survey

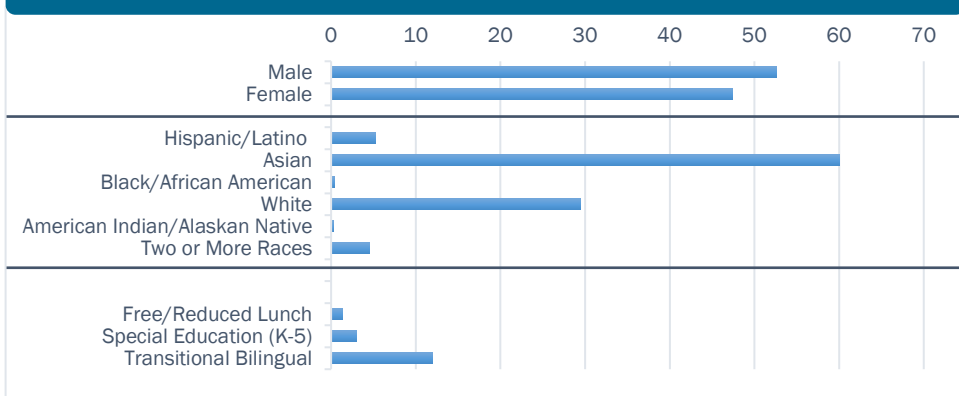
State Assessment Results
