

During the fall semester, within the first two weeks of Senior Seminar, Seniors in the Class of 2021 will begin scheduling their first Senior Advising Appointment with their College Counselor.

This guide exists to preview topics your son or daughter will be discussing in their first meeting with their College Counselor. We believe you, as a family, are the number one most significant influence on your son or daughter's college aspirations and decisions. We hope you will explore these conversations with your son or daughter and consider you will want to discuss with their college counselor when you have the opportunity to meet with them as a family this fall.

Senior Advising Topics

The following are topics your son or daughter will want to reflect on and be ready to discuss ahead of their first Advising appointment:

- Reflect on your Junior Year?** How did you feel about your GPA or SAT Scores? How has your junior year shaped your goals for this School Year?
- What did you do over the Summer?** Did you participate in any enrichment opportunities? Did you work? Do you have any stories from the Summer that may be part of your College Essays or you need to add to your resume?
- What goals do you have for your Senior Year?** What is important for you this school year? Are you going to be involved in anything this year that you are excited about? (*ex. like a club or on a sports team*)
- What is your plan?** What is your plan after graduation? What post-secondary pathway are you looking at colleges are currently on your college list?
- What colleges are on your college list?** Has your College list changed since the end of Junior Seminar? What fit factors are more important for you when evaluating colleges?
- What concerns or worries do you have for this school year?**
