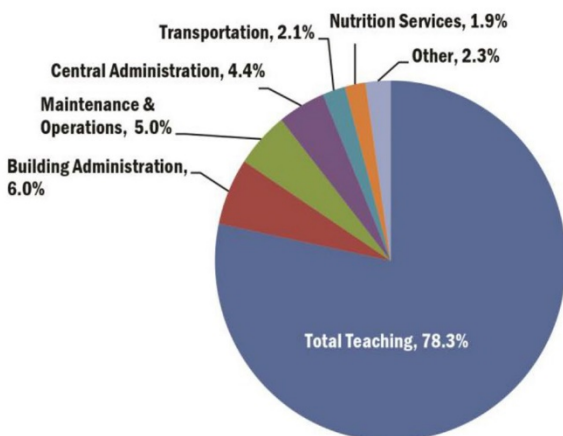
School Description

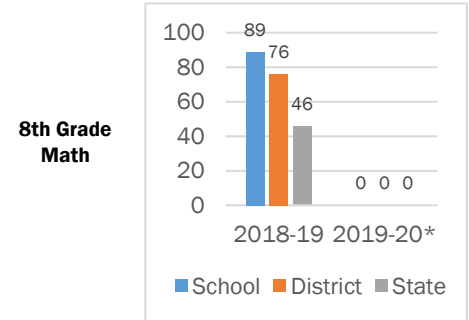
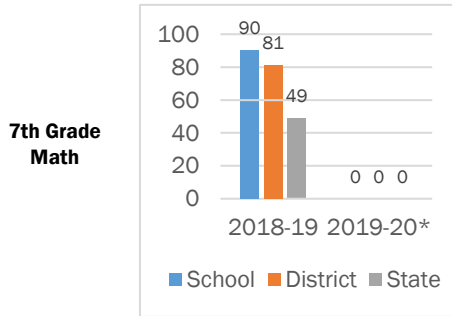
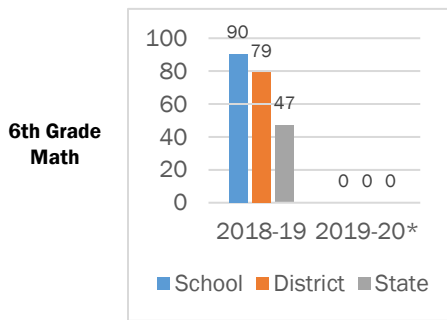
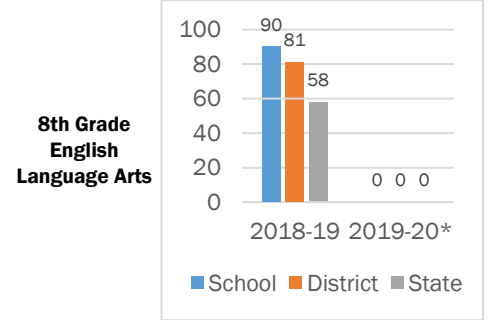
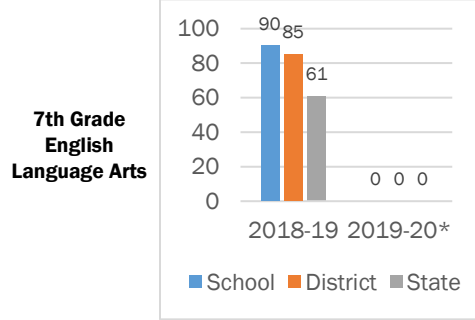
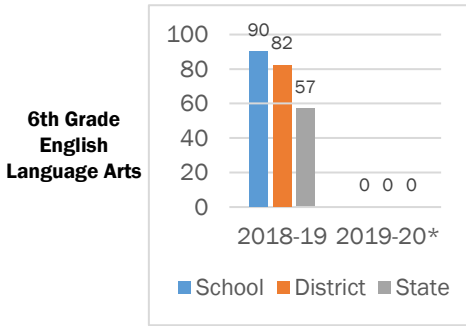


2019 20 School Goals

- Grades 6-8 English Language Arts (ELA): 90% of students at standard on ELA SBA
- Grades 6-8 Math: 90% of students at standard

- Achievement gap: 85% of special education students will meet or exceed standard on the Math & ELA SBA
- College & Career Readiness: All students will complete Xello's Matchmaker and grade-level specific assignments as part of their High School and Beyond Plan.

- Discipline: Continue to refine our communication processes around minor behavior infractions at school so that we can partner with parents to support positive student behavior and decision making

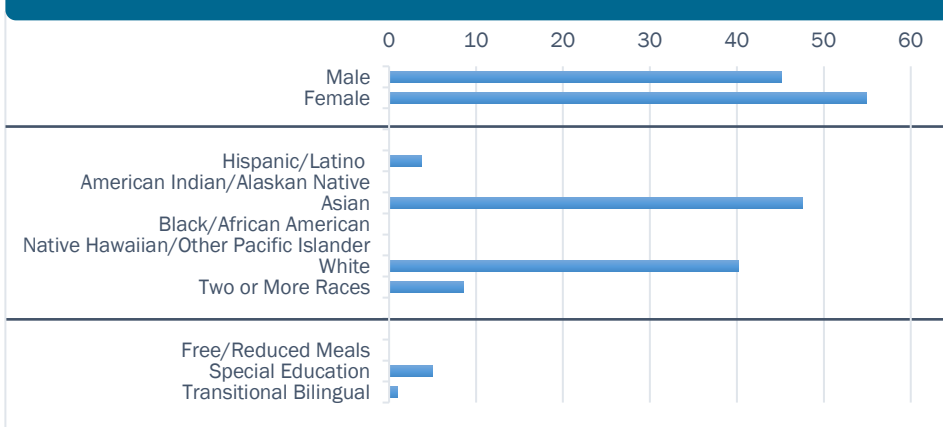
State Assessment Results
